



Return of the Holiday Party!

Although concerns for the Covid-19 pandemic are not—and may never be—totally behind us, enough of you have asked to bring back our traditional end-of-the-year Holiday Party that we think we may get enough club members who are willing to take on whatever post-vaccination risks remain in holding such a group dining event indoors, to again plan on having it, Sunday, December 4.



One unavoidable change this year, as we have all experienced lately, is that inflation, and with it, food prices have risen. As a result, even with the club subsidizing the costs to hold the event, with the club paying for the appetizers, fees for having an in-room cocktail hostess, and the lion's share of the 20% function service charge, state and local meal taxes, and gratuity, unfortunately, our

per person costs to attend have gone up rather steeply. Bottom line, because Princeton Station has increased its banquet meal pricing, we have had to increase our *all-inclusive" Holiday Party prices as well. This year the club will need to charge \$38.00 per person, but this does cover meal tax, gratuity and facility charges and includes entrée, appetizers, salad, rolls, coffee/tea and dessert.



One other small change this year to be aware of: Andrew Bass has kindly volunteered to be the event coordinator and point person to receive your RSVP's, collect the checks, and handle all arrangements with the restaurant. 
down when we couldn't gather to pay our proper respects. For Frank, it was

Jack Horner and I went to this event to cheer on our club President Charles Dyer driving his TC, as well as club member Peter Ross, driving his J2. I was also happy to see Earle Tucker, previously of Historic Motor Sports, driving his Sprint Car.

It was a glorious autumn day. Jack drove us to Ipswich using back roads with beautiful foliage. We arrived in time to get settled near the hairpin turn. I thought that would be an exciting vantage point.

Each car individually drove/raced up the hill four times. The runs were timed. For the first trip up the hill, it

seemed like everyone was checking out the course, therefore going fairly slowly. But it was still nice to see and hear the cars. There was quite a variety of the pre-WWII automobiles – including MG TB, Jaguar, Alfa Romeo, Morgan, Auburn, BMW, Bugatti, Bentley and a Ford Model T.

When all cars had arrived at the top next to the Great House, they paraded down past us, waving to our cheers, some with passengers. Of course, there were safety ropes to keep the spectators safely away from the race course and further away from the action than we might have liked. There was one race official standing near the track at the hairpin turn. I commented to Jack that he was in a dangerous spot. But he was on the uphill side.

The second run up the hill was more spirited. One of the cars tipped up onto two wheels as he took the hairpin turn too fast. But he settled down nicely and continued the run

Bluebird Bitter

Hidden away behind the Black Bull Public House in Coniston is the Coniston Brewing Company. This outstanding brewery, run by Ian Bradley, is where Bluebird Bitter is made. The 3.6% session beer won Supreme Champion Beer of Britain 1998 at the Great British Beer Festival Olympia London and has continued to be awarded accolades in recent years. Ian Bradley, son of the owners of the Black Bull, has studied and graduated in the art of brewing, and in 1995 the Coniston Brewing Co. was built: you might say, since then, Ian's brews have gone from strength to strength! With its roots in the hotel and licensed trade The Coniston Brewing Co. knows a thing or two about providing discerning customers with quality and service. To the pure waters of the Coniston hills add the finest Challenger hops and wonderfully roasted pale and crystal malts. This allows the Coniston Brewing Company to use all their skill and instinctive know-how to create what must be described as the finest fully matured cask conditioned Ale. Six beers in regular production yield an output of 1600 gallons a week for distribution to 100 customer outlets. Acclaim is not limited to the U.K. alone, bottled varieties of Bluebird are shipped to the U.S.A., Sweden and Hong Kong.

Bluebird is a fine session ale with a light golden color. The intense resinous and spicy hop character which is the beer's hallmark is derived from the use of unusual quantities of English Challenger hops, each bale being individually and personally selected by the brewer. The malt is, of course, Maris Otter fermented slightly warm to give a soft fruitiness with a faint hint of scented geranium. In England, an "ordinary" bitter is a beer for everyday drinking – the kind of beer you can turn to again and again through a long evening of socializing at the pub. Bluebird Bitter is an extraordinary "ordinary." The bottle-conditioned Bluebird is altogether different from other bottled beers – it somehow tastes and feels like beer from the cask.
