Go about 1.1 miles north on Ballardvale until you see the sign for Corporate Place 93 on the left, at 300 Ballardvale.

Directions from Boston/North Shore

Take Route 93 South to Storrow Drive. Take the Fenway exit. Follow Outbound /Riverway signs to Boylston Street (taking a right off the ramp). Boylston St. will merge onto Brookline Ave. Follow Brookline Ave. to the Riverway/Jamaica Way intersection. Turn left onto the Riverway (this will turn into the Jamaica Way). You will go through the intersection with Perkins Street (Max Warburg Sq.) and Jamaica Pond will appear on your right. Go 1/2 way around the rotary (Kelley Circle) and at the lights turn right onto Pond Street. Pond Street will turn into Newton Street. The museum is located in Larz Anderson Park on the right about a 1/2 mile from the rotary.

Take Rte. 128/ I-95 to Rte. 9 towards Boston. You will eventually pass the Chestnut Hill Mall on your left. Six lights after the Mall, you come to a major intersection (approx. 5 miles from Rte 128/ Rte. 9 intersection). Take a right onto Lee St. (If you pass the reservoir on Rte. 9 you've gone to far). Follow Lee to it's end. This is Newton St. Turn left onto Newton St. Stay to the right around the bend. The museum is in Larz Anderson Park which is 1/4 mile on the left.

Directions from Boston/South Shore

Take Rte. 3/ I-93 to exit 11. Granite Ave/Ashmont. Follow Granite Ave north to second traffic light, then turn left onto Rte. 203. Follow Rte. 203 (also called Gallivan and later Morton Blvd.) to the rotary where the Arborway and Rte. 203 meet. Follow the Arborway for 1/2 mile, merging left with traffic. You will come to a second rotary (Kelley Circle). Follow the rotary 3/4 of the way around to the light. Turn right onto Pond St./Newton Street. The museum is located in the park on the right 1/2 mile from the rotary.

Come On! Let's Rally! More Fun in the Rhode Island Weekend.

"Let's Start a Rally Program" was one of the ideas that came out of last year's AGM in Long Beach. Since JANE's Rally Program had gone dormant over the past few years, I thought it would be a good time to bring it back to life at the 2004 Concours Weekend! After all, JANE is a car club, is it not? We invited everybody to stay over Saturday night after the Concours banquet to participate in our first Rally in many years. The day started with a light drizzle and although 13 cars were signed up for the Rally, only 6 ended up competing. We had a lot of fun, even though nobody had national winning times. Bill Bassett presented some very nice trophies including the "Broken Spoke Award" for the last place finisher! Those who participated had a great time and encouraged us to continue with the program. OK, now it is next year... and we have another Rally for you. This will be a sanctioned JCNA Time-Speed-Distance Rally as part of our Rhode Island Weekend. Come on and enjoy the fun! It's easy - all you have to do is bring your Jaguar and a navigator while you drive a prescribed route.

For those of you who have never participated in a rally, or have forgotten what it is all about, I thought it would be worthwhile to summarize the sport as JCNA intends. The only rally that JCNA recognizes for national award competition is a "Time-Speed-Distance (TSD) Rally." "What's a TSD Rally?" you ask?

First of all, if the word "Rally" brings visions of specially-equipped racing cars tearing over back roads with thrills and chills - like what you might see on 'Speed Channel' or read about in 'Road & Track', forget it. Rallying, as explained by JCNA's website, "is a safe, enjoyable motor sport that tests your Jaguar's reliability and responsiveness, a driver's ability and a navigator's accuracy in interpreting specific route instructions. A RALLY is a competition in which cars individually leave a starting point at a carefully recorded time (T), and are instructed to accurately follow a designated route (distance D) while maintaining specific various rates of **speed (S)** along this route until they reach the finish where all participants 'rally." JCNA's website goes on to provide all the information you need to understand the sport. Just click on Rally Information and you will find a well-written series of chapters with instructions and rules. In case you are too busy to download the rally information from the website (or are 'computer-challenged'), I will try to summarize some of the key points here by answering some of your questions if you have not rallied before.

- 1.How much time does this "Rally" take out of my precious weekend? Depending on how many teams participate, we should be finished by noon and be ready to hand out trophies before lunch. Tech inspection of cars starts at 12:30 p.m., drivers/ navigators meeting at 1:00 p.m., and the first car rolls out of the starting gate at 1:30 p.m. The route should take slightly more than three hours.
- 2. How far does the "Rally" go? Our Rally route is approximately

- 80 miles long through delightful, paved back roads and small towns in Southern Rhode Island. No dirt roads or 'sump-busting' roads are allowed on a route sanctioned by JCNA. We will start out from the Bassett's parking lot and end up at the finish line about three to three and a half hours later.
- 3. What if we get lost? If you follow the instructions correctly you should have no difficulty. The instructions are not so complicated, but your navigator will have to pay close attention to them. The most important advice from JCNA is: "THE NAVIGATOR MUST READ EVERYTHING (in the Route Instructions) LINE BY LINE! AND, DON'T GET LOST!" In the event someone cannot find the route, we will provide a cell phone number to call at the start-finish line to guide you to the finish line!
- 4. What do these 'Route Instructions' look like? All JCNA-sanctioned rallies use the same wording in the Route Instructions. The definitions are provided on the website and will be handed out to participants at the driver & navigator meeting prior to the start. The definitions are in the form of abbreviations, such as "BAS" meaning "Begin Average Speed" or "BR," meaning "Bear Right." Sometimes an instruction depends on words from a roadside sign and the words will be in capitalized quotations, like "SUNNYVALE FARM-STAND." A building might be the cue for an instruction, such as "BR at Church" (Bear Right at the church), or if the Rallymaster wants to throw in some trickery, "BR at Steeple."
- 5. What are the requirements for participation? Your car must pass a simple technical inspection to make sure it is roadworthy. License, inspection sticker, lights, brakes, horn and wheels as you must have to be safe on the road. You need a driver (of course!) and a navigator (only one no 'back-seat drivers'). If you would like to be considered for JCNA awards, you must be a member of JCNA (all JANE members qualify) and your car must be a Jaguar.
- 6. What about special rally instruments? JCNA allows any equipment except the following which are SPECIFICALLY PROHIBITED:
 - ?Aftermarket Electronic and Electro-Mechanical and Mechanical Rally Odometers
 - ?Held or Portable Electronic Computers
 - ?Aftermarket Electronic On-board Trip Computers (original Jaguar on-board trip computers in the models they were designed

for are OK)

- 1.OK, what should we bring to help us have fun? Any equipment for time and distance monitoring other than the ones listed above is permitted. A well-prepared rallyist brings such items as stop watches, rally slide rules or rally tables, paper and pencils, and a clipboard. The odometer in your car is indispensable for a TSD Rally.
- 2. What do we need to know about this 'Rally?' Here is what JCNA says: "Just before you start, you will be given a set of General Instructions and a set of Route Instructions that are to be adhered to and exactly followed. Each rally car containing a driver and navigator team is expected to be on course and on time all the way along the rally route. To ensure this, they will be observed and timed at various unexpected and possibly hidden 'Checkpoints' along the route. The winners, of course, are those cars and teams who have most exactly negotiated the route with the least amount of timing error at checkpoints and at the finish." We will have a meeting to answer your questions and to hand out the instructions before the first car is started.
- 3. How do we make sure our odometer is reading correctly?

 Odometer accuracy varies from car to car depending on a number of things, such as tire diameter, tire pressure, quality of the speedometer, condition of the speedometer cable, etc. So we have a way to make put all cars on an equal basis. As you start, you will set your odometer to 'zero.' The first 10 mile stretch of the route is easy to follow and a clearly-marked 10-mile marker is posted. Just compare your odometer reading with the 'official' 10-mile point and you can determine a correction factor for the distances shown on the Route Instructions.
- 4.Math frightens me. Do I really have to do a lot of calculations? People have different reasons for participating in a Rally. Serious Rallyists love the combination of puzzles, cars and maps and that is what draws them to the sport. However, you can opt to just go along for a ride in the countryside forget the timing and just follow the instructions. It is up to you. I once read an account of a rally sponsored by The Touring Club of New England back in the 1950's when a sports car showed up with driver and navigator without any timing devices and won the rally by 'seat of the pants' navigation! Who knows? The same might happen to you!
- 5.Is there an entrance fee? We will charge a nominal fee of \$10 to help defray the cost of preparing the route instructions and purchasing trophies.
- 6. Who is in charge? JANE is fortunate in having Joei Bassett be our Rallymaster. She has had many years of experience participating in rallies in California. Others in the club will be helping out with routing, manning the checkpoints, and scoring. The Rally will be run under the rules and instructions provided by JCNA as a sanctioned event.

The final details are to be worked out, but the afternoon festivities include a JCNA-sanctioned rally (with an optional Fun Rally for those less inclined to be competitive) ending up for a lively awards dinner and overnight at the Willows Resort Motel and Restaurant in Charlestown, RI. Sunday's activities are still being arranged, but the group breakfast is not to be missed. Bill Bassett has reserved 10 rooms at the Willows Resort. Call and make your reservation for Saturday night, May 14th, referring to "Bassett". The price is \$80 per room. The telephone number is 800-842-2181 or 401-364-7727.

So get your Jaguars on the road, dust off those stopwatches, and let's rally! And party afterwards at the Willows!

Ray Swenton drove 232 miles from Portland to visit his Donovan restored E-type (which was in the showroom looking beautiful), the Curtis' and Thomas' brought the Mark VII 170 miles from the Lakes Region of NH, Stu Forer and John Fuller drove their XK120 racers from Warwick, RI, Klaus Nielsen arrived in his award winning XK140 OTS from Conn. Other Jaguars included Arthur Doty's very pretty E-type FHC, Alan Lieberman's beautiful 'E' OTS, and Cats driven by nearly 40 members from every state.

As he circled the car, you could see what a fine example it is! One of Donovan's many racing engines was started on a test stand as we finished up. 400HP out of 3.8 liters and it was as smooth and steady as any new V12. Donovan's makes their own pistons, cuts their own cams, and makes winning vintage races look easy.

A dozen or so of us made the very pretty short trip to Stockbridge and the Red Lion Inn for brews and light dinner before heading home. Thanks to Brian and his crew the new JANE season is off to an excellent start.

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
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
