



The Goodwood Revival Races – Doing Time In Apogee

I love *old speed*. Speed from small horsepower machines with hairy chested motors vibrating all to hell. Speed from wide open exhausts snorting angry fire and smothering you in decibels. Speed that rips over pavement at red line on skinny tires and hand hammered alloy bodies. Raw speed. The stink of hot Castrol and fried brake pads fills the air.

It doesn't take much to get me there either. Last August I opened my mail to find an invitation. This one was different. The paper had been starched, maybe even ironed smooth by the service staff. Royal Mail on the postmark. "The Earl and Countess of March request the pleasure of your company at Goodwood..." I didn't need to read much further before I was making plane reservations to England.

Because of what I do, I am invited to and provided hospitality at some of the world's grandest motorhead events. The Goodwood Motor Circuit, on the south coast of England is famous for its wheel- to-wheel racing around its classic circuit totally untouched by the modern world. The track is based on one of Europe's oldest and largest sporting estates, Goodwood. Home to the Earls of March for centuries, it offers twelve thousand acres of sheep-grazed rolling hills and forests, a stellar horse racing circuit, several castles, an old WWII RAF airfield, and the motor track.

Racing has been at home there since the 1940s. In June, there is the Goodwood Festival of Speed for newer race vehicles, and in September, the Goodwood Revival Meeting. The Revival pumps lust in my veins more than any other meet. Four days of vintage racing with early motorcycles, cars, and acrobatic flying in WWII vintage aircraft, a car auction, a big party and lots of that good old speed.

Goodwood is a different deal all right. First, racing is taken very seriously. The track was filled with fleets of blower Bentley specials, Jaguar C and D-types, Cooper Climaxes, cycle fendered Bugattis, fifties Testa Rossa Ferarris, Velocette Thruxtons, Vincent Black Shadows – any car or motorcycle from the thirties to the sixties with mythical performance and a race heritage. No posers here. Everyone drives or rides at full throttle, with seemingly no fear of roll over or spin out. Alternating races were charged with "tin top saloon racers" - hopped up Jaguar Mk. VIIs, Mk IIs, Armstrong Sidley Star Sapphires - everything and everyone was there.

Then there were a hundred thousand spectators. The four days were sold out to ticket holders before even opening the gate. It is the tradition with the Revival that everyone wears vintage gear from the forties or fifties. Nothing was from the back of the closet or Goodwill shop. Women wore sling pump heels, hats with veils, fox head stoles and print dresses. The guys were in head-to-toe authentic RAF WWII uniforms, or fedoras, black and white spectator shoes, vintage duds all around. Mechanics, car pushers, track corner workers all wore white jumpsuits, neckties, brown wing tip business shoes, and snap-brim wool caps. Blink and you'd swear you were in pre war England.



At the start of each race, the Queen's Royals and Blues in full military dress uniforms trumpeted off the cars at starting line. A Marilyn Monroe dead ringer was strutting her stuff in a tight polka-dot dress for the photographers. Real folks were there too: Sir Stirling Moss, in a wheel chair of all things, Carroll and Cleo Shelby, "Gentleman" Jack Sears (I'd never heard of him, but people were following him around for an autograph), Lord Montague of Beaulieu. Then there was a mysterious woman from Argentina who raced and wrenched her own type 35 Bugattis, Giacomo Agostini of motorcycle fame, – anyone who was big in mid



century racing.

A Bonhams car auction on the grounds offered a collection of classic European sports-racing cars - holed up on an English gentleman's farm for the last fifty years. The lead car, an unrestored thirties Mercedes SSK roadster broke a world sale record. It was hammered in at over seven and a half million US dollars to a secret off site bidder. The smell of money and merlot was in the air that night.

Saturday night Lord March hosted a party for motorhead VIPs, the likes of which I have not attended elsewhere. It was a black tie /Venetian Carnivale themed costume ball. Indoor fireworks, court jesters, Venetian acrobats, thousands of lilies and gladiolas, Napoleonic cos-

tumed guests arriving in vintage Mercedes gullwings, chauffeured open Lagondas, New Phantom Rolls Royces, and blower Bentleys. Open bar and dinner for 1,500 guests. The whole pavilion was decorated as a Venetian palace complete with watered canals, and statuary. WWII aircraft – P-51 Mustangs and Mark VIII Spitfires were moored out front.



The racing was still the best of the Goodwood Revival though. Standing at trackside, I could literally feel the thunder vibrate on my chest from the open exhaust of thirty racecars at redline screaming past me. Cars and drivers from Europe, Australia, the US and South America competed. It didn't really matter much who or what won the races, it was all about that old speed on an old track.

#### Lime Rock HPDE

I don't know who was more impressed that I was going to take my car to Lime Rock my friends or me. I've only had the car since December. But I've had the need to race it since I was ten and my first Aurora HO slot car tore around the Model Motorway. That little car was a red, 1970 XKE fixed head coupe. And so was the one I drove Friday June 3, 2005 at Lime Rock Race Park.

Once I had the car it seemed obvious that I should run it. The Jaguar Association of New England (JANE) website had a calendar of events listing all kinds of great things, but slalom racing and the Lime Rock event spoke to me. I hit the internet, checking the Jaguar Club of North America (JCNA) site, printing out the slalom course layout, pouring over the safety equipment and tech inspection requirements.

Emboldened by an article on Vintage Racing which appeared in Classic Motors (formerly British Car), I emailed club member Margo Otey for info about the Wilmington Slalom event. Margo's cheerful and energetic response –along with the promise of a club-provided helmet sealed the deal. I was going to do the slalom. In a flurry of racing exuberance, I also sent in my registration for Lime Rock, made hotel reservations and bought banquet tickets. Definitely, on a roll. With the administrative formalities out of the way it was time to focus on the car and driver skill.

Steve Weinstein's article on driving slalom in the Jaguar Journal couldn't have come at a better time. I read and re-read the article until I could confidently conclude, 'just do it'. This, combined with the knowledge that I would get classroom training at Lime Rock was enough that I now turned my attention to the car.

Think how impressed your family and friends will be if your car breaks in half on the track and you kill yourself. Get thee to an expert. During one of those all day layovers at the airport, where you buy every magazine that remotely interest you ...I saw an ad for Ayer-based KTR Performance Racing. Many services are advertised in the back of magazines, but this was a European magazine, everything was price in Euros (remember I said it was an ALL DAY layover). You must be special if you are in Ayer, Massachusetts and advertise in Europe. When I visited the shop, I learned they were very special.

These guys work on every kind of sports car imaginable. All kinds of vintage and modern race cars were there in various stages of creation, preparation and repair.

General Manager Andrew Funk doesn't say much, but he knew what I needed to make sure the Jag was safe for my Lime Rock weekend.

KTR went through every system on the car and replaced parts as necessary. Six hours were spent just checking and tightening nuts and bolts. A set of Pirelli P4000 from Tire Rack completed the preparation effort.

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I rented a U-Haul car carrier to transport the car to Lime Rock. Its not that I wouldn't drive the car –but I have far more experience pulling a trailer than I do loading a weekend's worth of tools, gear and spares into an E-type and going head-tohead with the Massachusetts driving public. Besides, driving for the first time at Lime Rock was adventure enough.

Lime Rock is just outside Lakeville CT and I arrived on time and without incident.

When I arrived, it was easy to find out what to do and when to do it because fellow enthusiasts were everywhere. I didn't even need to ask; I stopped the rig and was greeted with a compliment on the car. After that, I was given information on everything from where to eat to the paddock spot for the Jag Club.

I pulled the car over to the track and checked in at the main gate. From there I proceeded to the paddock are and spotted some familiar cars. I pulled into an open spot and backed the car off the trailer.

I watched the other drivers taking pieces parts out of their cars –anything that wasn't attached or absolutely necessary. Spare tires, jacks, decking –I did the same.



The organizers announced the gathering of participants and we all moved to the track. The schedule for the day was announced and first time drivers and those wanting refresher training were directed to a classroom.

Instruction included handling characteristics of cars at speed, safety equipment and defensive driving, rules for the track—including the flags and what they mean and a description of the course itself. We were then assigned individual instructors and given the session schedule. A session is a race. The checkered flag signals the end of a session. A black flag pointed directly at you can also signal the end of a session. Safety is number one and the race steward keeps a sharp eye on all drivers.

My instructor was Tony Clarkson. Tony knows Lime Rock really well having raced there since at least the early 1960's. Tony made me comfortable with my car and my capabilities. Tony gave turn by turn instruction and helping me smooth my progress with each lap.

I completed my first session and was hooked on driving at Lime Rock.

I drove two more sessions that day. The car performed perfectly –it never overheated or burned oil and always felt safe. One driver was not so fortunate and spun, flipped and rolled a new Ferrari. Luckily he was not injured, but the accident reminded us all that driving at speed is not without risk.





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
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
