

ANE will be holding a Dyno Day at KTR Motor**sports** in Ayer, MA on Saturday, April 28th, starting at 9:00am. You can either sign up to have your car dyno'd, or just show up as a spectator to observe the action and drool over the many sports, vintage street, and race cars that KTR maintains.

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If you'd like to dyno your

information on the dyno and some at KTR. It has a 32,000 square examples of dyno graphs. The dyno at KTR also measures the stoichiometric (air-to-fuel) ratio over the entire RPM range. The correct ratio, neither too rich nor too lean, will improve drivability. It will also ensure that you do no engine damage. Running too lean can cause burnt valves and overheating; running too rich can cause fouled plugs and poor gas mileage. You'll get a graph of power and torque versus RPM. Stu's XK120, which had its engine built by noted Jaguar race engine builder Tivvy Shenton, was too lean. At the last dyno session, they had both Tivvy's and Stu's

cars dyno'd by KTR, and repaired a lean condition in each of them.

The Concours Judges L Training Session will be conducted by Aldo Cipriano on Sunday, April 29th, commencing at 10:00am at Hoppe Tool, 107 First Avenue, Chicopee, MA. Breakfast and lunch will be furnished, and the session will include the annual judges' test, seminar, and actual judging of several club members' vehicles.

This year, we are seeking a greater number of judges than usual, because it is the 35th anniversary of the JANE Concours and we are expecting an expanded field. This year also marks increased collaboration between

JANE and JCSNE in conducting the judges' seminar and reciprocating with the use of judging teams at both clubs' Concours events. We will also invite other judges outside of the New England region in an effort to expand cooperation and create more uniformity in on-field judging standards.

Slaloming is a low-speed run through a field of cones. You make three passes per run (eggshell shape, a crossing X, and oval) before exiting through the stop cones. Times generally run between 40 and 50 seconds per run. The course is easy to learn and becomes second-nature to drive. Each driver has five timed runs. Your best run determines your finish that day. Instruction is JANE provides helmets (S, M, L, available.

The dates for the 2007 Slaloms are May 6th and September 9th, with the first car off at 10:00amrain or shine. Please arrive a bit early for tech inspection and to walk the course. The events should conclude at about 3:00pm. Be sure to add 4 to 6 PSI to your tire inflation pressures!

The cost will be \$20 for JANE members and \$25 for non-members for each date. Cars (not drivers) are charged the entry fee, so that husband and wife, for example, may each take a turn behind the wheel!

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

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The JCNA Annual Ceneral Meeting

The Jaguar Club of Houston did a terrific job of organizing a successful event this past March 23-24. Everything went smoothly, the accommodations and food were first class, and Friday night's outing was awesome. The meeting venue was the Hilton Houston Post Oak near the famed Houston Galleria and it was a first-rate venue all around.

Friday business consisted of two technical sessions covering new Judging Guides, one covering the Series III E Type, the other the 1976-91 XJ-S. Both judging guides can be found on JCNA's website or through the 2007 AGM event report on JANE's site.

The Friday night social event was fantastic—a visit to a private collection of over 900 cars owned by John M. O'Quinn. A wellknown figure at recent collector car auctions, his collection is extensive, quite eclectic, and growing rapidly. His long-term plan is to establish a permanent museum in the Houston area to house his collection, but Gavla Miller, the Executive Director of the collection, said that would take three to five years. In the meantime, you can visit the collection only by special arrangement, and we were told that only one more group would be allowed to visit before the distant grand opening. It was easy to appreciate their concern about crowds—the cars are closely packed into a giant warehouse and most are in pristine condition.

The collection had some really fine classics, including a recently-acquired 1938 Talbot-Lago (\$3,350,000), several stunning Delages and Delahayes, at least a half dozen Deusenbergs, numerous Packards, Cords, classic Chryslers, and at least two Hispano Suissas. There were also several E Types and XKs, three or four 300SLs, etc., etc. There was

also a pretty impressive collection of real antiques from the brass era.

At the other end of the spectrum was a collection of beautifully-crafted but weird hotrods and custom cars that could have been (and probably some were) right out of the Oakland Roadster Show. In the middle was a seemingly unfocused assortment of American cars from the 50s and 60s. And of course there was one of the Batmobiles. Cameras are not allowed, so there are no photos.

Following the tour of the collection, we were taken to a local brewing company for free beer and some excellent Texas barbecue. It was a really memorable outing and the Houston Jaguar Club is to be commended for putting on such a good show.

Saturday was devoted to business, with the morning occupied by the usual committee reports and the afternoon by delegate voting on proposed rule and bylaw changes. Full details on all of these can be found on JANE's website. Some highlights include:

- Jaguar North America reported on its poor 2006 sales results and its plan to reemphasize Jaguar performance and luxury. What happens to the X Type? Look for an all-aluminum XK in 2008.
- Membership chair Doug Ingram reported a slight decline in total

JCNA membership in 2006 and renewed JCNA efforts to work with affiliated clubs to boost club numbers and initiate new clubs. Also, a new "Young Enthusiasts" membership class for 18-to-25-year-olds was introduced with reduced JCNA dues to promote younger members.

- Concours Chair Dick Cavicke reported on continuing efforts to standardize judging through the preparation of JCNA Judging Guides for various models (two new ones were adopted by delegate vote), support for multi-club training sessions, and tighter JCNA sanctioning standards for judging.
- Several significant concours rules changes were ratified, including a split of concours classes C16 and D9; establishing separate classes for the XK8 and new 2007 XK; procedure changes regarding large cleanliness/ condition deductions; new rules on the authenticity of pin stripes and license plate brackets; and limitations on the display of club badges and dash plaques.
- Two significant new rally rules were adopted. First, JCNA members can get JCNA approval to count points earned in non-JCNA rallies toward the JCNA rally championship. The procedures for this don't appear to be clear yet. Second, rally scores will accrue to both driver and navigator rather than by team.



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Saturday night's guest speaker was Marti Eulberg, Executive Vice President for Marketing and Sales for Jaguar of North America. She delivered an enthusiastic talk about Jaguar's return to its roots, i.e., emphasis on the high-end cars and on performance.

About fifty awards were given out, so it was impossible to keep track of them all. A couple of the more important were the Andrew H. Whyte Award for long-term service to JCNA, which went to Kurt Rappold from the Delaware Valley Jaguar Club, and the Slalom Award, which went to Karen Jones for her fastest-ever slalom time in Jim Roberge's Series III E Type.



t the March Monthly Meeting, JANE's Bruce Murray treated Aus to a show he'd put together depicting his escapade copiloting a 1932 Maserati 8C3000 Grand Prix race car in the running of the 2005 Mille Miglia. He'd had the good fortune of being invited to participate in what is truly a once-in-a-lifetime experience. After a refreshingly brief introduction by President Carl Hanson, Bruce started off his presentation wearing the traditional racing cap and goggles that adorned his cranium in the actual event. His show comprised an assortment of video clips, still photos, maps, charts, and graphics that drew and kept the crowd's rapt attention. Bruce narrated with his usual humor and aplomb, and by the end we all had a great feeling for what it was like to wend through Italy's city streets and countryside in a cramped, hot, but classic race car, accompanied by a few hundred other significant world-class classic automobiles that included some fantastic Jaguars, for three days and 850 miles, dodging normal traffic in some places and waving to cheering throngs in others. 


fortunately, much of that expanded information is still incomplete. For example, we have occupational notes on only 177 out of the 262 active members. Even these limited data reveal some interesting

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


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
