**When:** Saturday, October 13, 2007, 12:30 pm. First car off at 1:00. Dinner at about 5:00.





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
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# Rallying the JANE Way — Redux

ANE is continuing to run its Rally program this year, as a part of our local and national club's Point Program, as we'd described back in the February *Cat*. As one of our club's rallymasters, along with Steve Thomas, I'd like to restate our take on what local club rallies should be, and what you all can expect when you participate in this year's Fall Foliage Rally on Saturday, October 13th.

And, even more importantly, I'd like to describe what a rally should not be, especially at the local club level. The goal here is to encourage more members to get into the rallying spirit, so that we can look forward to the good turnouts that we often see at our other club events!

The fact that many people still have a misperception of what rallies at the local level are supposed to be is possibly the result of observing or participating in SCCA types of rallies, which are highly competitive with lots of tricky features, all designed to test the skills of advanced rallyists to the utmost. Because SCCA rallies are designed this way, all contestants, regardless of class (beginning to expert), must follow the same route sheets, which often results in participants getting lost and never finishing the rally. This can lead to a feeling of defeat and frustration—and never wanting to do a rally ever again!

Now let's talk about our kind of rally! A JANE rally!

Steve and I (and especially Steve's wife, Diana) have worked hard to offer an event that will challenge the serious rallyist, but is also a pleasant tour of back roads and the countryside, hopefully on a lovely day, that is laid out for the first-timer in such a manner that no one gets lost. As a matter of fact, we would feel that, if anyone did get lost, we'd have failed you, and the club, as rallymasters!

Our rallies incorporate some challenges, and a cute gimmick here and there, but should be nothing more than an enjoyable day out with our fellow Jaguar enthusiasts. However, a Jaguar is not a prerequisite and, as with our Slaloms, this is "Run what you brung!" So, if the day turns out such that the weather isn't conducive to bringing out the Cats, then bring out the family van, the station wagon (they still make them?), the pickup truck, or whatever! Because this is all about camaraderie!

Everyone will have fun! Granted, you might have a minor screwup, or maybe miss a few answers in the optional gimmick part of the rally, but then you can laugh it all off with the rest of the gang at the rally's conclusion over a good meal and libations!

JANE rallies, the way we're running them, will more often than not be three events in one! If you just want to come along for the ride and tour the rally route, enjoy the scenery (and your Cat) while following the route instructions, drive at your own pace, and then share good times at the end, so be it! Chances are, you'll be a contender for the "Broken Spoke" award (that is, last place), but who cares!

For others, if you only want to run the route and do the fun gimmick part, answering all of our tricky questions along the way, then have a ball! There will be prizes and awards for you also!

Finally, for those of you who are a little more competitive, want to earn points in the JCNA points competition, or are just looking to give your Time-Speed-Distance abilities a workout, our rallies are for you as well!

This, then, is the kind of rally that members have to come to understand that JANE runs. I hope I've been able to dispel whatever misconceptions some may have had about being put through the SCCA type of rally 'wringer', being made fools of, and possibly getting lost and having a miserable time. This is not, and should never be, the purpose of a local club rally—especially a JANE-organized one!

Steve and I have done two rallies together now for the Alfa Romeo club and JANE, and we have had nearly 100 entrants between the two events. No one has ever gotten permanently lost or failed to finish! And that, fellow JANE members, is all that your rallymasters are looking for—just to make sure that everyone has a good time!




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

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
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
