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

From the North: Take Exit 35 (Kendall Road, Route 113) and at the bottom of the ramp turn right on Kendall Road (Route




113). Follow Kendall Road for 1.3 mile until you cross the Merri-

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
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

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

GILFORD, NH (Saturday, October 13, 2007) — Reports of numerous Jaguars roaming around the Lakes Region spread through the local haunts. Norm Soucy, proprietor of the Village Store, confirmed that several owners of these cats entered his establishment for sandwiches as the beasts gathered around the corner in the Village Park. At 1:00 pm, the Jaguars lined up and exited the park at regular intervals, following some unknown but apparently well-defined and irresistible path. The creatures were next spotted wandering in seemingly random patterns along the shores of Lake Winnipesauke and over the tops of Alton and Avery Mountains; they were clearly hunting. The cats traveled alone, along paths of blazing color, under beautiful skies. They paused for a brief moment in Barnstead before continuing their quest. The Gimmick portion of the rally consisted of a sheet of photographs depicting 12 distinct landmarks along the route. The object was to identify the landmarks and record where along the route they were spotted. appreciate everyone who came to this event. Participants make an event, and Diana and I had a great time!





n Saturday, October 13, I and others were the invited guests of Jaguar Motors and the Regional Representative of Jaguar, Mr. Richard Kelly, at the introduction of the new Jaguar XF model held at the Institute of Contemporary Art in Boston, Massachusetts. In addition to the food and beverage served, the galleries of the museum were opened for the attendees, courtesy of Jaguar and Mr. Kelly. Those in attendance took advantage of both the fare and the opportunity to view the exhibits. The museum is located on the Boston waterfront next to Anthony's Pier 4, resulting in an exceptional venue for the introduction. As a result of an unavoidable delay, the XF arrived somewhat late-but it was worth waiting for!

viewing the car in person for the first time, you realize that the photographs do not fairly represent it. In person, the car is more attractive and striking than the

photographs reveal. Many of the articles talk about how perfectly proportioned the car is. Viewing the photographs, it is difficult to understand the point the press is making in those statements


until you actually see the car, and then the "rightness" of the proportions becomes clear.

On the outside, the car has many of the styling cues of the new XK. There are also hints of Jaguar's past design break-

that made
the company
a leader and
its vehicles
coveted. It
has a taut,
purposeful,
desirable, and
contemporary

appearance. It must be made clear that this car is by no means "retro"—it is a fresh and new design.

The interior is also worthy of the praise the car has received. Mr. Callum and his group without question worked very diligently on this project to come up with



these results. Unfortunately, we were not able to drive the car, so I cannot verify the media reports on its handling or ride characteristics. However, taking into account the accuracy of the reports on the appearance of the car in the press, one can easily infer that the descriptions of its ride and handling are also accurate.

With this new design theme, the new styles for the XK, and the new XJ due in approximately one year, Jaguar is on the road to recovery. The XF should be at the dealers in March 2008. Given the comments heard at the introduction, if you have any intention of buying one, now may be the time to make your desires known to your Jaguar dealer.

The JANE Board Votes for a Change in Annual Dues

The Board voted to change our 2008 dues as follows:

- Annual Dues:
 - Full Membership with printed Coventry Cat: \$60 as in 2007
 - Full Membership with on-line Coventry Cat: \$50 as in 2007
 - Associate Membership with printed Coventry Cat: \$40. This represents an increase of \$11, as a distinction between on-line and printed CC for Associate Members, and was overlooked in 2007.
 - Associate Membership with on-line Coventry Cat: \$30. This is an increase of \$1 just to round off the numbers.
- Amounts due from new members during the periods:
 - November 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008: Full 2008 annual dues with payment covering the full period through December 31, 2008. This represents no change from current policy and is consistent with JCNA dues policies.
 - July 1, 2008 through October 31, 2008: New members are credited with the \$9 reduction in dues to JCNA that is in effect from July 1, 2008 through October 31, 2008. In addition, members opting for the printed cat should benefit from the printing/mailing costs not incurred in the first half of the year. For the sake of having nice round numbers it is proposed we offer the following schedule for this period:
 - o Full Membership with printed Coventry Cat: \$45
 - o Full Membership with on-line Coventry Cat: \$40
 - o Associate Membership with printed Coventry Cat: \$25
 - o Associate Membership with on-line Coventry Cat: \$20.
- Early Payment Discount: We will retain the \$5 discount for renewals prior to January 1 to encourage prompt renewals.

- 2. Partial year dues apply from July 1 through October 31.
- 3. \$5 early payment discount applies through January 1.
