# The Top Ten Reasons Why I Sent My Mk IV to England

The question I get asked most frequently about my sending the Mk IV to the UK is: Why? I'd thought about it for quite a while before I shipped the car. There were several reasons, so I thought I'd form them into a list. Here they are, David Letterman-style.

**Reason Number 10** I thought the shipping costs would be much higher. I don't know what I expected, but after I got quotes, it wasn't that bad. \$3250, one way, was a small price to pay.

**Reason Number 9** The exchange rate isn't that bad. It really was at its worst when I shipped the car, so it had to improve. And, lo and behold, it's come down by \$0.10 per pound and looks like it's headed lower. That will save lots of dollars. David Davenport, the restorer, has a car that's in limbo because the owner thought the exchange rate was the opposite of what it really is, a mistake of 4 to 1–what he thought was \$15,000 was really \$60,000 (30,000 British pounds). The car had been shipped from the US before the customer realized his mistake, and it sits in the UK awaiting resolution. The restorer works in pounds, pays his suppliers in pounds, bills in pounds, and is paid in pounds.

Reason Number 8 The suppliers are the same anywhere: some good and some bad. One supplier I used in the UK had some parts to be rebuilt "in process" for over two years; US suppliers were also good and bad. Some work on the body and chassis had to be done over, but the quality of work on the fenders (wings), trunk (boot), and hood (bonnet) by the same shop was first-class. (See Figures 2 through 5.)

# Reason Number 7

Wood is available around the world. Due to a less-than-reliable supplier whom I had trusted with my wood restoration, I lost the complete set of wood for my carsome 14 pieces, counting the dash and cubby box doors. It's not as easy as one would like to think to find wood for a 1948 car. A LHD DHC is different from a RHD DHC. Most LHD cars were exported, particularly to the US, so finding the right wood in the UK was a problem. After searching the world (literally, via the Internet), I finally found a RHD dash -- in Wales. But Dave Davenport came to the rescue. Between him and his wood supplier/restorer, they came up with a complete wood set for a LHD DHC. (See Figure 6.)

#### Reason Number 6

I don't have all the parts. When I bought two Mk IV's, they had been partially disassembled, so I had two cars and a pickup truck full of boxes of removed parts. The obvious parts, like the front and rear fenders (wings), were there, but (as an example) what about the nuts and bolts that hold on the chrome trim? There are literally hundreds of fasteners, a lot of them special. I couldn't count them or the hours it would take me to find them. (See Figure 1.)

#### Reason Number 5

The USA guys are good, but the UK guys aren't exactly chopped liver. The shops in the US are just as good as the ones in the UK. I think one advantage that the UK has is a better network of support services. By the way, the shop rates are pretty much the same: 38 pounds per hour, which is \$75 per hour.

# Reason Number 4

The expertise on Mk IV Jaguars isn't too far from Coventry. Most US restorers, with a few exceptions, know XKs and E-Types, but when it comes to Mk IVs it's difficult to match the experts in the UK, such as David Davenport of Davenport Cars. He's the restorer of choice for the Jaguar Daimler Heritage Trust (JDHT) and the Jaguar Museum. On my two visits there, there were always five to ten cars in the shop, from SS1s to Mk Vs, including some that are very rare (and expensive). And there are at least 25 cars in storagecustomers' cars that are registered and roadworthy.

#### **Reason Number 3**

I need a better skill set. I'm a klutz. I don't have the fine motor skills and I also have short, stubby fingers. Those equate to a lousy outcome when detailing work has to get done. So I've hired a better set of hands to finish up the car.

# Reason Number 2

I'm too old. I'd rather screw up my back (or other parts of my body) hitting a golf ball, as opposed to lying under a car on the concrete in the cold. I'm not that good at golf either, but it's fun and good exercise. Working on the car is fun, but I don't know about the exercise part.

#### **Reason Number 1**

As the Cable Guy says, "Git her done!" The Mk IV restoration has been a series of fits and starts. 2002 was a great year for progress; 2003 was less so; 2004, 2005, and most of 2006 were lost. 2002 was the year of the body and chassis. In 2003, most of the bodywork was complete. 2004 and 2005 were the years for the engine, transmission, and drive train work. 2006 didn't show much progress, although late in the year my son, Hank, volunteered to help and I got a big lift from that. 2007 started out on a good note, but I looked at what still had to be done and made the decision to have someone else finish the car. I had estimates for cost-to-complete from shops in the US and the UK, and had visited several of them. I picked Davenport Cars in the UK as the shop to do the work. (See Figure 7.)

Now I had to ship the car there (see my "Back to the Future" article in the February 2008 Coventry Cat). The months of August, September, and October were spent preparing the car, going through the inventory, and packing for shipment. I had most of the bolt-on body parts in storage, so I had to retrieve those. I thought I had the wood parts in storage at the restorer but, alas, no parts could be found. (That's another story that I won't ever publish.) We temporarily put the bolted-on parts on the car to consolidate the shipment. The rest of the shipping prep went well-some 19 boxes and 15 loose parts later, the car was on its way to the UK.

I have a number of events in the summer and fall of 2008 already scheduled for my Mk IV, including my wife, Marilyn's, niece's wedding, the 2008 JANE Concours, and the British Invasion. So, besides the Cable Guy, Marilyn also says, "Git her done!"
