JANE lost two key people in the month of May ... Many events ... Skip's is closing ...

Mark Alosa, General Manager of Jaguar Exeter, died suddenly on Tuesday, May 20, 2008, at the family home in York, Maine. He was only 40 years old. Mark and Jaguar Exeter have been among JANE's most generous supporters. Mike Kaleel and Brenda Soussan attended the funeral service, and JANE sent a floral arrangement.

Welost Bernie Yurt, the founder of the original New England Jaguar Club, the New England XK Association (NEXKA), on May 25, 2008. Bernie was 78 years old when he died and the longest member of JANE. Our club was started 40 years ago by Bernie Yurt and was renamed JANE in 1986. In memory of Bernie we will be renaming the President's Award the Founder's Award; it will be engraved with the NEXKA logo and the JANE logo. JANE is making a donation in Bernie's name to the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Additionally, Carl Hanson, past president, has been working on the history of JANE and is preparing a historical document in two copies, one for the club and the other to be presented to Bernie Yurt's family. See the article about Bernie on the JANE website.

Hope to see you there.








In Memoriam

Bernard V. Yurt – Founder of NEXKA (became JANE in 1986) January 28, 1930 – May 25, 2008

ernard (Bernie) Yurt, of Medway, MA, passed away on Sunday, May 25th, at the Metro West Medical Center in Natick. Bernie was the founder and first president of the New England XK Association (NEXKA), which became JANE in 1986. His 1954 Jaguar XK120 OTS with license plate number "ONE 20" was a fixture at NEXKA and JANE events right from the first club event, a picnic at West Hill Dam in Northborough, MA, in September 1968. Bernie continued his membership through the entire forty years of club history, making him the longest member of JANE to date. He was extremely knowledgeable on all aspects of Jaguars and finally parted with his beloved XK120 only last fall. Pictures of Bernie and his wife Audrey are prominent in the early club events documented in the photo albums in JANE archives. Audrey passed away in 1985. Bernie is survived by his second wife, Janet, and many children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. One of Bernie's daughters, Laurianne Storme, of Blackstone, MA, came up with the name of our newsletter, The Coventry Cat, when she was 11 years old.

Besides his love of Jaguars and other English sports cars, Bernie had other interests. He was a talented musician, as a trumpeter in various orchestras and swing bands in the area. His occupation was as a specialist in electronics, having worked at Foxboro Corporation for 25 years as supervisor of digital production. He served in the United States Air Force during the Korean conflict.

Funeral services for Bernie were held on Thursday, May 29th, at the Community Church of West Medway, in Medway, MA.





ark Alosa passed away on Tuesday, May 20, at his home in York, ME. Mark was general manager of Jaguar Exeter and general partner in Firepoint Properties and Conspiracy Creative, a marketing solutions company. He recently founded GoGreenGarb.com and was marketing vice president and director for Patsy's Inc. and the Profile Group.

Collings Foundation Tour and Tailgate Picnic

Collings Foundation Headquarters in Stow, MA, on Sunday, July of the surroundings by holding a tailgate picnic before the tour! Fill 20th, when the Collings Foundation will open its aircraft and automobile museum collection to a private showing for AONE and its guests. For those of you who have never seen this fabulous collection, it's a real treat!

The Collings Foundation's collection is one of the hidden treasures of the Boston area. On display are over sixty-five antique automobiles and race cars that include the 1932 Duesenberg Dual-Cowl SJ Phaeton owned by Fred Duesenberg; a 1940 V-16 Cadillac Limousine custom-built for Al Capone; a 1927 Rolls-Royce Phantom I Phaeton built in Springfield, MA; and an Indy Car driven by Mario Andretti. The aircraft collection includes a rare original 1909 Bleriot Model XI; a WWII vintage Fiesler FI-156 Storch; and a 1943 Cessna UC-78 that was formerly flown by Revere Airways. Also on display will be several micro-cars owned by the Charles Gould Foundation. These three-wheeled cars were produced by former aircraft manufacturers Messerschmidt, Heinkel, and BMW. There is also quite a number of Indy, formula, and midget race cars, and in general a very eclectic collection of really interesting cars and airplanes.

In addition, the Foundation's grounds are themselves worth the trip! It's a beautiful setting, with lawns and gardens that complement the

LeMons Car Makes Its Debut

It was a beautiful day for a slalom as the XJ40 VDP LeMons Car was loaded onto the trailer. Only a week before, the last bits of the once plush interior were removed to make room for the specification roll cage to be fabricated and installed by Alan Quinn. Armed with a new set of Torx bit-drivers and an impact wrench, Tom Letourneau and Ed Hall freed the car's headliner by removing door trim, tread plates, moulding, and interior panels. A quick vacuum to remove screws, clips, wire, and debris revealed the sophisticated strength and construction underlying the originally well-appointed sedan. Stu Forer's trailer was at the ready to provide transport from Ed's garage in Berlin, MA, to the Nashoba Valley Ski Area.

You have only one chance to make a first impression, and Aldo Cipriano arrived early to give the LeMons Car a quick dust-off and shine.

Oil, coolant, and tire pressure were checked one last time. The trailer ramps were set and the car was driven aboard. Heavy nylon webbing with giant ratcheting mechanisms locked each corner of the car to heavy-duty 'D' rings welded to the trailer.

Even with the XJ40 weighing in at around 4500 lbs., the rig towed easily. It was a quick trip to the slalom site. We pulled in alongside the trailers that had delivered some of the slalom greats, like Jim Roberge's modified Series III E-type and Dean Cusano's special XJS. The LeMons Car came off the trailer and joined tech inspection already in progress.

The LeMons car was assigned number 100, and after removing the loose spare tire from the boot, it passed tech inspection. "Lucky 100" took its place in line to slalom.

The first lap is hour-glass shaped; the second lap a figure-eight; the third and final is an oval. The car was running smoothly, and there was a certain serenity sitting in the lone, upholstered seat surrounded only by a high-tech body shell and wiring.

I rolled my foot into the throttle and the big engine and big car responded. Smoothly and surely building speed, straight line travel wasn't going to be a problem. But straight line travel isn't what the slalom is about. And into the first turn it was obvious that the nationally ranked slalom cars had nothing to fear. The shocks on the car are original and the car heaved up into each and every turn. The tires aren't the best, and with the extreme body roll and redistribution of weight to the front, it was easy to break away and slide off course and into the cones.

The LeMons car finished intact, with a one-run time of 56 seconds and one cone (3-second penalty).

The LeMons race is August 23-24 in Stafford Springs, CT, and work on the car continues on Saturdays at Ed Hall's in Berlin, MA. All are welcome to join in the fun.



Sunday Brunch Tour to Blue Moon Diner

unday, May 4th, the intrepid among JANE members ventured out Of for what promised to be a delightful back roads tour to open the spring driving season. Our tour started at the usual JANE meeting place, Skip's Restaurant in Chelmsford, with the goal of reaching the Blue Moon Diner in Gardner, MA, in time for brunch. Alas, the weather gods were not cooperative. A drizzle of rain greeted us in the morning as we set out for Skip's for the proposed meeting time of 8:30 am. As we fortified ourselves with hot coffee, people started to show up, and the drizzle turned to a downpour. By departure time of 9 o'clock, a hearty group of ten people in five cars braved the deluge to set out for what we hoped were drier conditions. Among the five cars were three Jaguars – my 1951 XK120 FHC (touring on a rainy day is a good reason to have a fixed head coupe!), John Doolittle's 1960 Mk 2 (right-hand drive, no less!), and the Kennedys' XJS. Oh, yes, there was also the Halls' famous "Jagillac," followed by the Eklofs' German car (name starts with "B," claimed to be waterproof ... where is the adventure in that?).

The route wound north toward the NH border through North Chelmsford, then west toward Dunstable, Pepperell, Townsend, Ashby, Ashburnham, and ended in Gardner for a total of 44 miles in an hour and a half. On a nice day, it is an enjoyable drive through classic New England countryside. On a rainy day, it is . . . well, wet. One deep puddle drowned out the ignition on my old Jaguar. I came to a dead stop while leading the five-car parade. All five cars obediently stopped, probably assuming that this was a trick thrown out by the tour leader. No, sorry folks, my car stopped dead. Oh, it cranked away happily all

right, but no start. (Not to worry, been there, done that!) Much to the amazement of my fellow tourists, a quick wipe on the distributor with a towel (all experienced XK120 owners carry towels in their cars!) resulted in a restart. Thanks to Dennis Eklof for holding the umbrella over me during the wipe! By now, we were wondering what would be next -- a river flood? a road washed out? But as we drove farther west, the deluge turned to rain, and the rain turned to drizzle, and by the time we reached Gardner, the roads were dry!

At Gardner, we found street parking for all five cars in a row just across from our destination, the Blue Moon Diner! This is one of the classic old Worcester lunch car diners from the forties, with a small addition on back for a few more tables. It was featured in the 1992 movie *School Ties*, which launched the careers of Matt Damon and Ben Affleck. The Blue Moon features typical diner food – just what you want for a Sunday morning brunch. Lots of coffee, eggs easy over . . . corned beef hash and home fries was my choice for brunch. Others chose eggs and sausages, crabcakes, pancakes – the usual diner menu. Jamie Floyd, the young woman who owns the diner, was pleased to have us come and show our lovely cars, adding to the lively atmosphere. The diner was very busy, as it is nearly every morning.

We will do it again sometime . . . and maybe add a few other New England diners to the list. Let our Activities Chairman, Harry Parkinson, know if you have a favorite diner and would like to organize a road tour some Saturday or Sunday morning!

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



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
