




# Fall Slalom September 7th

Get Ready for the 2008 British Invasion! Jaguar is one of the two featured marques this year, and JANE will be a big part of the action! Every year the British Invasion (BI) is the largest British car show in the Northeast...not only that, but it is being called the largest "All British Lifestyle Event on the East Coast of the United States." Whew! Starting Thursday, September 18th, and running through midday Sunday, September 21st, there will be British cars buzzing around the mountain roads and villages around Stowe in north central Vermont. The big show, of course, is the "British Classic Motorcar Show and Concours d'Elegance" on Saturday, the 20th, starting at 8:30 a.m. The show grounds will be covered by upwards of 800 cars, large tents with food and merchandise vendors, and smaller canopies of clubs and parts suppliers. # **Tri-State Fall Foliage TSD Rally** October 18th

🖊es, it is almost that time. This year's annual JANE Fall Foliage Tri-State Rally will take place on October 18th. A rain date L has not been set, and hopefully we will not need one.

This year's Rally will start from the parking lot of the famous Purgatory Chasm State Reservation (http://www.mass.gov/dcr/ parks/central/purg.htm), which is located on Purgatory Road in Sutton, Massachusetts, right off Route 146 either northbound or southbound. It is very easy to find no matter where you may be coming from. From the Providence area, Worcester area, Boston area, or any of the major Interstate routes, there are direct links to hooking up with Route 146. The Tourist Center at the Reservation does not open until 8:30 a.m., so have breakfast before you leave home or on the way, and grab that last cup Tom Letourneau of coffee somewhere before you arrive at the Reservation, as the Drivers' Meeting will begin at 8:30 and the first car goes out at 9:00 a.m.

There are reasons for the early start! This year's Rally is for two clubs, the Jaguar Association of New England and the Alfa Owners of New England. We hope this combined effort will bring out lots of participants. I promise that the route will be extremely interesting, with some great scenery along the Tri-State route (Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island). Plus, our Rally route will take us by Thompson, CT, and we have managed to get permission for our rallyers to take a quick tour of the old SCCA road course at Thompson Speedway. We will make this one of the check points along the route, and you will have the rare opportunity to actually take a spin around the course.

The destination of our Rally route is designed to be of special interest to the women participants. So come on out for a fun day of rallying, after which we will have the awards presentations and dinner at a very nice restaurant. The restaurant will provide us with a five- or six-item menu from which to choose

In order to eliminate the last-minute, time-consuming registration process, so we can get our early start, and so we can give the restaurant a head count, we are requiring pre-registration and payment. (More information about the pre-registration process in next month's Coventry Cat.)







# Jungle Cat Racing Thrives and Survives 24 Hours of LeMons!

Jane's Jungle Cat Racing Team prepped and raced a salvaged, 1993 XJ40 for the 24 Hours of LeMons race at Stafford Springs Motor Speedway. The race, called "The Ultimate Test of Not-So-Bright Man and Shockingly Crappy Machine," was the very first 24-Hours of LeMons venture in the Northeast. The race is run six times a year around the country.

Drivers Gary and Matt Hagopian, Chuck Centore, Tom Moses, Adrian Curtis, and Dennis Eklof, together

with Aldo Cipriano, Crew Chief Bruce Murray, Alan Quinn, Buzz Hawes, and Ed Hall worked steadily to complete the car before traveling to Stafford Springs, CT. Day-before-the-race tasks included draining coolant, adding sponsor decals, installing the 5-point racing harness to the seat, provided by crew member Tom Letourneau, and securing high-density foam padding to the roll-cage. Even removal of the big cat's airbag was a day-before-the-race task. Adrian and Gary successfully removed the airbag, using instructions received overnight from a blogger in England.

A couple of last minute issues set hearts racing. A late morning call from the LeMons' organizers required the team to remove the racer's front windscreen. A spider crack had developed in the windshield on the driver's side. Any crack in the driver's line of sight requires that the glass be removed. There was no time to replace the windshield; the team would run without one. Windshield anxiety was replaced by that sinking feeling when the racer failed to start (for the first time ever) as it was time to load the car and depart for Connecticut. A quick tech check revealed a dead battery. To be sure, Aldo Cipriano acted to secure a spare starter from sponsor Millis Auto Salvage.

Saturday at the Speedway dawned warm and foggy. The Jungle Cat team joined the line of trailers and cars queuing up to enter the paddock. It was the first time the competition showed itself.

Once inside the gate, the team registered and prepared the racer for tech inspection. With tech inspection – more tough news. The tech team

was duly impressed with the XJ40, but with a small rust-hole behind the driver's seat and the uncovered battery, Jungle Cat couldn't pass tech. A team meeting and "round-the-horn" discussion revealed our best options. Bruce scrambled to the auto parts store to buy a plastic battery box, and Tom would go pit to pit to ferret out a welder and steel plate.

There is a spirit of camaraderie and cooperation at most races, and LeMons was no different. The Alfa team had a welder and plate stock, which they immediately offered. George Jones had arrived at this point and wasted no time jumping in to help Gary shape and weld the plate into the floor behind the driver's seat.

The car passed tech easily this time and the racers lined up behind the pace car.

By the drawing of straws, driver order was established. Gary would start off, followed by Chuck, Tom, Adrian, Matt, and Dennis. Drivers would drive 20 to 30-minute shifts for the next 14 hours – or as long as the car lasted.

In addition to surviving the stress of continuous racing and the mechanical challenges of keeping a salvaged car running, the team had to deal with draconian, yet comical punishments. Meaningless infractions, like hitting a cone or putting a tire in the dirt, were met with a Black Flag and time in the penalty box. There, drivers would throw darts at a board to determine their fate!

Tom Moses sat out 30 minutes for hitting a cone and had to wear an electronic dog collar for "driver training." A junky rearview mirror was welded to the hood of the XJ40 when Jungle Cat failed to yield the race line to the competition. For spinning out, "naughty bunnies" were welded to the car roof by Arc-angel, the official LeMons welder. Chuck was tarred and feathered. And Adrian, Gary, Matt, and Dennis did their time, too.

The unit is welded to the offending car's bumper. Upon impact, the rods are forced through the radiator, bringing to an end the life of the offending car. With the throttle wide open, each team captain was invited to place (or pour) any item into the oil filler until the engine blew. It didn't take long. Jungle Cat Racing contributed two liters of Coca Cola.

In the end, the Endurance Karting team's Miata won, and our Alfa friends, Alfa Romeo Milano of Scuderia Limoni took third.

Jungle Cat Racing hovered mid-pack throughout the race and finished #20.
