### **Everyone Was a Winner - JANE Tours SNG Barratt**

t was about 40°F on a beauti-**⊥**ful and sunny Saturday morning when I drove the XKR, still covered with a bit of winter slop, up to Manchester, NH, to visit

and tour the facilities of SNG Barratt. Upon arrival I met Tonya Lee, wife of Tony, the general manager, and the crew

of SNG.

The tour kicked off with coffee, donuts, and other goodies, and by 10:30 a.m. we had 35 JANE members in attendance (counted by Tonya). Attendees were asked to put their names on tickets for a raffle following the tour. We went into a meeting room where SNG had a display of Jaguar parts and accessories. Tony began by introducing his staff and giving the group a talk on the status of Jaguar (spares) parts. SNG has access to over 180,000 parts worldwide, and this list continues to grow as more parts are remanufactured. The USA location in Manchester stocks about 20,000 parts: mechanical, electrical, panels, trim, and more.

Tony gave us a brief history of the company, which was actually started "across the pond" in the 1970s by Stephen Barratt. Like many of us in attendance,

Stephen was a gearhead, who bought an older E Type to restore and then purchased another for spare parts. After the restoration he advertised the labeled with Jaguar part numbers. Tony commented that they separate spare parts and was amazed at how many others were looking for those right- and left-hand pieces to ensure that the correct parts are shipped. hard-to-get parts. Thus, SNG Barratt was born.



importance of customer satisfaction with the materials they provide; he wants happy customers and repeat business. A case in point, he used a piece of Cantrail chrome from my Series 3 E Type as an example. When the SNG part didn't fit, SNG purchased the same part from another USA supplier, and this part also didn't fit. Tony contacted his colleagues in the UK, and SNG is going to remanufacture the part in brass, bend it, trim it, and chrome it to match the

SNG also offers a 10 percent discount to JANE members on most items. Simply identify yourself as a JANE member and you'll receive the discount.

After a brief question and answer period we began the tour. We divided into two groups, some heading first to the trim shop, others to the warehouse.

The parts warehouse is organized on racks of shelving and in bins

Upstairs at SNG Barratt is the trim shop. They have a huge "closet" full of patterns. Patterns for every Jag model, from the carpet to the seats in, where the tables were full of Jag accessories. Tony announced that to the headliners and door panels. And they have shelves and cubbyholes full of leather, wool, vinyl, piping, and even a lightweight plastic material they use to replace the cardboard interior parts that deteriorate and lose shape over time. It's hard to guess how many people stood with mouths hanging open as they saw the expertly stitched leather seat covers on the workbench for someone's E Type. You would swear it came straight from SNG Barratt for being such gracious hosts, and supporters of JANE. 🦃 Coventry. Members walked around caressing the leather and carpet fabric as if it were cashmere or silk. Simply amazing.

Following the tour the JANE group went back to the room we started the far left table contained more than enough items so that everyone who entered a name on a raffle ticket would go home with a prize. 
### **JANE Members Making News**

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### To Preserve or Restore . . . That is the Question By John Darack

basic dilemma for old-car owners arises when but getting tatty around the edges. Would it be more beneficial to strip it down and restore it, or to work with what is there and gently bring back the appearance of a good used car? Not such a simple question, as several more quandaries are also involved. What is the goal of the owner? What special attributes might a particular automobile possess that would either benefit or be hurt by either approach? What about the relative cost of one process or the other, and the ultimate effect

on the value and aesthetics of the car? In the end, it's not so simple to select the "proper" course of attack.

In the case of my 1954 Jaguar XK120 Coupe, the decision was an easy one for me. I essentially appreciate and seek out well-preserved, wellmaintained cars. Most restored cars look alike to me, especially if they have become static display pieces and have lost their basic functionality as automobiles. They must appeal to my sense of design and my desire for sporting performance and handling. To my eye, and to the seat of my pants, the XK120 Coupe (FHC to those of us with our noses in the air) represents an ideal combination.

About a dozen years ago, while dropping my E Type off for service at a local vintage Jaguar repair shop, I espied the very lovely and very original appearing Coupe that immediately became the object of the sort of lust that I had previously reserved for svelte redheads. To further enflame my ardor, it was factory equipped with the SE option package. Its owner, Frank, was the quiet type who didn't show it or bring it to events, so it had flown under the radar and was not generally known to local enthusiasts. He just maintained it for his personal enjoyment and had done so for 30 years! Of course, it was not for sale. He responded kindly to my inquiry by inviting me to visit him at his nearby home and to go for a ride. Needless to say, after he offered to let me drive it, I was utterly smitten. Frank and I hit it off nicely, and he promised to call me if ever he decided to find it a new home.


About a year later, he actually called! The circumstances of his life had changed and he wanted to talk to me about his Coupe. Long story short, about a month later I drove it home, and I took the longest possible route to get there!

Over the years quite a lot of mechanical freshening has been necessary, A car is in well-cared-for original condition, none of which has changed the outward appearance at all. The incredible patina of its 1970 paint job and unaltered interior are truly charming. The interior had never been redone, including the varnish on the burl walnut dash. The seat cushions always bothered me, though, as they were dried out and split in ways that were not repairable. I just couldn't bear to have them reupholstered, as the interior would then have looked out of character with the rest of the car.

For several years I searched both locally and through national media, hoping to find someone who was replacing their interior and might have the old leather available. It would have to be faded red, with plenty of the background brown showing through. A couple of false chases ended in disappointment, but then a call came from a member of JANE, offering me the leather from his XK120 OTS, which he was replacing. For Joy!

When I arrived at his home, I was terribly let down to observe that his old leather had been dyed a garish shade of red. I could see, however, that some remote spots had not been covered with the awful dye and seemed somewhat close in color to my seats. Not exactly what I was looking for, but there was a glimmer of hope.

I dragged the motley stack of drooping leather home, and did some testing with leftover cans of various solvents that were in a corner of the garage. I discovered that acetone removed the dye, and if I worked quickly with it, it evaporated rapidly and didn't seem to have any deleterious effect on the underlying leather. The base color under the dye was perfect! So, armed with toothbrushes, sponges, and rags, and protected with rubber gloves, long sleeves, goggles, and a painter's mask, I had at it.



After about three hours working outdoors (with several breaks to clear my solvent-sodden head), I had cleaned up enough pieces of the old leather to patch in the various damaged panels of my seats.

Acetone, toothbrush . . . the works!

I took the whole mess to Jonathan Chase, whose shop in Marlboro is known as Skin and Bones. Although I knew him only passingly at the time, I knew his reputation as a highly skilled fussbudget of an upholsterer, with many high-quality restorations under his belt. I explained my objective, and he assured me that he could use my patches to fix up my seats. He disassembled the cushions, reinforced their basic structures,

and fiddled with the replacement bits and pieces until he was assured of good fits. He then conditioned the leather to make it soft and lustrous, and the result was remarkable!






Jonathan Chase, at his "Skin and Bones" shop, disassembled and reinforced the cushions, then used my leather patches to recover them.

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
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


