


Clare Moses Walks for Breast Cancer

We met each other in Manchester, NH, with a timely boarding of a 6:40 a.m. flight routed through Chicago's Midway Airport, arriving in Indy shortly after 1:00 p.m. Our trip to the Crowne Plaza Hotel started off with a short hop on the Green Line Bus with a bus driver who had been having her second day in a row of having a bad day. Fortunately we arrived without any major problems, but also realized that we were only a week away from the incoming rush of people for the Final 4. As we were checking in, we met up with Dennis and Prebble Eklof, who had arrived the day before to take in the Indianapolis Motor Speedway and the planned dinner at Harry and Izzy's.

After a brief trip to the hospitality room to register and peruse the auction items on display, it was time to get ready for the evening's event. On the Concours front, Driven cars less than 35 years old cannot be trailered to the Concours for entry, annual training for all certified judges must be maintained, factory overmats must be present and judged, and uniformity of paint/color and finish on all exterior panels must be judged accordingly. A point of contention which was passed was the prevention of for-sale signs on vehicles by vendors and entrants. Inasmuch as each club can operate independently of JCNA and set their own guidelines, as a delegate I felt that it was wise to have this passed as a fall-back position in case any clubs may end up with a problem situation at their Concours event. Stacey posed several questions to the Board for clarification on these issues.

Kurt approached Stacey and me during the Hagerty Insurance seminar about accepting the award on behalf of Prebble for the *Coventry Cat*. Since Dennis and Prebble were not registered as delegates, Kurt was not aware that she was at the meeting, but we quickly let him know that she would be able to receive the award at the banquet, and we couldn't wait to see the expression on her face at the announcement.





Prebble does an amazing job each and every month, and our club's members should be very proud that our own *Coventry Cat* is one of the best publications in JCNA.

The evening quickly came to a close and we were off to our rooms, but not before Stacey and I received an invitation to go to the Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg Museum with my old friends Jackie and Joe Maletsky, along with Bob and Fran Maidl, all members of the Jaguar Touring Club of New Jersey. I met Jackie and Joe over 30 years ago at one of my first Jaguar events, and they have been great friends ever since. Haynes Guide to Tools of the Trade

Deing caregiver to an elderly English car Ooccasionally requires me to refer to something called a "Haynes Manual."

This comes in the form of a softcover book written in a language at once both familiar and confusing, often referring to terms like "spanner," "prise," "near side," etc. Thanks to the wonder which is the Information Highway, stumbled across the following link -- http:// www.mez.co.uk/haynes.html -- which leads

to a virtual Rosetta Stone of automotive terms that every DIY (do-ityourself) Jag mechanic should know.

"The Real Meaning of the Haynes Instructions" was reprinted in the March 2010 Coventry Cat. For those of us who don't know our Google from our Goggles, here's another installment of valuable information -- the tools of the trade. ... Dave Herrick

is nowadays used as a kind of divining rod to locate expensive parts not far from the object we are trying to hit.

ELECTRIC HAND DRILL: Normally used for spinning steel Pop rivets in their holes until you die of old age, but it also works great for somewhere under the workbench with the speed of light. Also removes drilling mounting holes just above the brake line that goes to the rear fingerprint whorls in about the time it takes you to say, "F...." wheel.

PLIERS: Used to round off bolt heads.

HACKSAW: One of a family of cutting tools built on the Ouija board principle. It transforms human energy into a crooked, unpredictable motion, and the more you attempt to influence its course, the more dismal car upward off a hydraulic jack. vour future becomes.

MOLE-GRIPS/ADJUSTABLE SPANNER: Used to round off bolt heads. If nothing else is available, they can also be used to transfer intense welding heat to the palm of your hand.

OXYACETELENE TORCH: Used almost entirely for lighting various flammable objects in your garage on fire. Also handy for igniting the grease inside a brake-drum you're trying to get the bearing race out of.

WHITWORTH SOCKETS: Once used for working on older cars and motorcycles, they are now used mainly for impersonating that 9/16 or 1/2 socket you've been searching for for the last 15 minutes.

DRILL PRESS: A tall upright machine useful for suddenly snatch-**HAMMER:** Originally employed as a weapon of war, the hammer ing flat metal bar stock out of your hands so that it smacks you in the chest and flings your beer across the room, splattering it against that freshly painted part you were drying.

WIRE WHEEL: Cleans rust off old bolts and then throws them

HYDRAULIC FLOOR JACK: Used for lowering car to the ground after you have installed your new front disk brake setup, trapping the jack handle firmly under the front wing.

EIGHT-FOOT LONG DOUGLAS FIR 2X4: Used for levering a

TWEEZERS: A tool for removing wood splinters.

PHONE: Tool for calling your neighbour to see if he has another hydraulic floor jack.

SNAP-ON GASKET SCRAPER: Theoretically useful as a sandwich tool for spreading mayonnaise; used mainly for getting dog-doo off your boot.

BOLT AND STUD EXTRACTOR: A tool that snaps off in bolt holes and is ten times harder than any known drill bit.

TIMING LIGHT: A stroboscopic instrument for illuminating grease buildup.

TWO-TON HYDRAULIC ENGINE HOIST: A handy tool for testing the tensile strength of ground straps and brake lines you may have forgotten to disconnect.

CRAFTSMAN 1/2 x 16-INCH SCREWDRIVER: A large motor mount prying tool that inexplicably has an accurately machined screwdriver tip on the end without the handle.

AVIATION METAL SNIPS: See hacksaw.

INSPECTION LIGHT: The mechanic's own tanning booth. Sometimes called a drop light, it is a good source of vitamin D, "the sunshine vitamin," which is not otherwise found under cars at night. Health benefits aside, its main purpose is to consume 40-watt light bulbs at about the same rate as 105-mm howitzer shells during the Battle of the Bulge. More often dark than light, its name is somewhat misleading.

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

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
