

JANE at Lime Rock Vintage Festival



The East Coast vintage highlight of 2011 occurred over Labor Day weekend ... Lime Rock Park's Historic Festival 29 Presented by Jaguar! There was a big presence from Jaguar as it celebrates the 50th anniversary of the E-Type and the 60th of Jaguar's first win at Le Mans. This year's Lime Rock Park Historic Festival saluted the owners and collectors of the cars that helped make racing history. Jaguar team owner Bob Tullius, of Group 44 fame, was at the Festival most of the weekend. John Fitch was there. Jaguar XKR-S's were available for spectators to drive. And special stand-alone, Jaguar-only groups raced on Saturday and Monday of the race weekend.

Several JANE members took in the events as spectators, and JANE members Gary Hagopian (1963 E-Type) and Michael Kaleel (1954 XK120) raced, as did Gary's grandson Matt Hagopian in his MG Midget and Larz Anderson's Joe Freeman with his 1952 Kurtis racer.

The honored collector at this year's event was Philadelphia neurosurgeon Dr. Frederick Simeone, who had a very nice stable of beautiful, significant cars on display the entire weekend.

One of the highlights of the annual Vintage Festival is "Sunday in the Park." By town ordinance no racing is allowed at the track on Sundays, so the track is used as an exhibit area for cars. This year JANE's George Jones took home awards, with his 1966 maroon Mark 2 Saloon being Best in Class and Best Jaguar Saloon!



The big-doings at Lime Rock Park this year had to do with Jaguars. There was the opportunity to ride with a pro, and to actually drive the new Jaguar XKR-S at speed on the racetrack. Several folks, both racers and spectators, signed up and enjoyed the experience screaming around Lime Rock's 1.53-mile track.

Jaguar Cars was the event's sponsor, fitting for the E-Type's 50th year celebration. As in three other race events this year, there was an "all Jaguar" race, dominated of course by Donovan Motorsports' three Jaguars. In fact, they dominated all the races in which they were gridded.

Four hours later, at 10 p.m. Friday evening, we were back in Sunapee, dropping off the red car, and installing a competition seat, a transponder, race tires, and race distributor into the silver car, that job taking us till 1 a.m. Still bright and cheerful (?) at that late hour, the decision was made to turn around and go right back to the track! Another four-hour drive (all me!), and we arrived at our hotel in Lakeville, Connecticut, at 5 a.m. Two hours in bed, followed by a shower, and we were back at the track by 8:30 a.m. ready for Saturday's three scheduled races!

The silver car did well, taking the checkered flag in all of those races. I finished "in the bottom half," but had some fun racing another similarly prepared E-Type from Vermont, while Donovan collected all the "hardware." Some might question the sanity of one who would do what we did, but as they say, *the show must go on*!

Bottom line is that I enjoyed the weekend, the racing, watching my grandson, and the good wishes of our supporters, most of whom were JANE members.

In all that we do, my motto is that *to have memories, one must live memorably!* Now, let's see ... what went wrong with that motor?

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
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
