

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# **Event Reports**

### JANE Summer Slalom - A Rocky Road Takes a Turn for the Better! By Al Zanengo



**I** started off pretty poorly. My first official act as the latest in a long line of slalom chairs was the posting of our spring and fall event dates on the JCNA calendar. Within hours of that simple action on that gloomy winter day, all hell broke loose, or maybe I had just hit my first bump in the road. Coy analogies aside, in no time flat I was informed that our spring date conflicted with JCSNE's Concours, their one big money-maker, and additionally, their event utilized two of their biggest slalom junkies, who might abandon the Concours (slalom is addictive). Whether it was simply the selfish desire to compete in as many JCNA-sanctioned slaloms as possible, or noble aspiration, I chose to seek an alternative date despite the pressure from some quarters to just have one event for 2012. I began by seeing if we could trade dates with another club that utilized Devens, but the brotherhood of car clubs was unanimous in their desire not to trade. I then started looking at alternative locations and called great and supportive guys like Aldo Cipriano, Dean Saluti, Tom Moses, and Gary Hagopian, who put out feelers and explored their connections for me. Still no success, no good luck, but more naysaying from my peanut gallery. In desperation, I contacted Dean Cusano, of Motorcars Inc., and Ken Haas, who run JCSNE's slalom program. They got me in contact with the folks at Lars Parking, who rent out the open lot that they use in Hartford, CT. Though farther from Boston, it offered multiple dates to assure an event free from conflict with our other summer events, and it was \$300 cheaper. To top it off, Ken and Dean were willing to let us utilize their equipment and expertise, since I had spent one cold, rainy morning last year laying out the track with Tom Parish, but I was not by any means "experienced" or "knowledgeable," and Tom would be in California for weeks, working. For the first time in a long time, I thought that just maybe we could have some fun.

Quicker then the wink of an eye, it was July 14th, the day before our event. I got a room outside of Hartford, because a Comic convention and a Church convention had filled most of the downtown hotels. I met Dean and a group of his friends, some but not all racers, and had a dinner that included good food, great company, and great conversation while super heroes, wizards, and aliens walked by the restaurant. 
