JANE Car Badges for Sale - \$45 ea.



(actual size is 2" x 3")

This is a special order of 100 high-quality, chrome JANE car badges – <u>and well over half have already been</u> <u>sold</u>. These are the first that have been available for several years and it may be some time before another order is placed - so purchase yours now while they're still available! Quoting from the manufacturer, "*We use a vintage manufacturing process very similar to the cloisonne badges made in England back in the 1930s and 1940s. These badges are made to last 50+ years. They are not affected by the weather and will not tarnish, dull, flake, or fade."*

The badges come with two threaded, removable rods, a backing plate and nuts suitable for mounting the badge on a car grille or badge bar. The threaded rods are spaced approximately 1 ½ inches apart. Due to the variations in mounting locations and methods that buyers may choose for different cars, I know of no "universal" mount. Therefore, it may be necessary to fabricate a simple bracket to adapt the badge to your particular car or badge bar.

After two laps there was a lunch break with the return of the "Food Train" food truck that got rave reviews for their artisan paninis and fresh fruit punch from the spring slalom event.





Lime Rock Vintage Festival 2015

JANE member Brian McMahon recently attended the Lime Rock Vintage Festival during Labor Day weekend. He took many photographs of the people and the cars, presented here in his photo essay.





Brilliant driving by Jack Busch and painstaking race preparation by Donovan Motorsports enabled E-Type number 61 to win all four Group 7 events at Lime Rock this weekend. This annual event has attracted owners and drivers of vintage sports cars for the past 33 years and tens of thousands attended this year's competition. Art Hebert in E-Type number 63 added to the Donovan team's luster by finishing fourth in two races, and with a second place finish in the final race, 3 seconds behind his teammate. ***NOTE: Lime Rock race results (see Group 7 for Saturday and Monday http://www.race-monitor.com/Results/Race/35358) show Jack Busch driving #61, and Art Hebert in #63, despite the "Art Hebert" name on #61 in the photos *** They succeeded in holding off challenges from Porsche 911s, Chevrolet Corvettes and Datsun 240Zs in each of the 15 minute races around the mile and a half track.

A masterfully rebuilt version of my own first car, which I bought for \$250 in 1965. Among other problems, it was missing the gearshift boot, so driver and passenger could watch the pavement whiz by. Many years later, a friend who also owned a TR-3 had the same problem. Being more mechanically skilled than I, he worked on the car himself and purchased the \$5 rubber boot before consulting the car's shop manual. "Step 1, Open the bonnet and remove the panel from its hinges..." the step-by-step instructions began. Perplexed that he wasn't directed to start dismantling interior parts, he skimmed ahead and learned to his dismay that he had to disconnect the entire powertrain and hoist

it out of the car to gain access to the gearshift boot.






