
Please keep these members in your thoughts and prayers. I hope to see as many of you as possible at our upcoming events.








JANE Picnic on the Lawn at Larz Anderson Hosted by Dean Saluti and Margie Cahn

OUR SPEAKER – JOHN ELMGREEN FROM AUSTRALIA



John Elmgreen was born and grew up in Sydney and, after buying his first Jaguar XK, started collecting information on XKs throughout Australia. While he was living in London, he and Terry McGrath decided to turn their collective efforts into a book, and *The Jaguar XK in Australia* appeared in 1985. In 1996 he started the XK Lovers Internet group and expanded his assembling of XK information to the histories of every XK ever made (all 30,000 of them) and a detailed study of XK originality (having taken and collected more than 10,000 photographs). These may become further books in due course. He has been a commercial lawyer in Sydney for many years in a boutique practice, and his other interests include an active interest in music.



The First Ever International Jaguar Festival, A Judge's Perspective

By decree of JCNA, this year was the first year for the new International Jaguar Festival, which will take the place of the former Eastern and Western States Meet. This event will alternate across the country every year, as with the States Meet.

Coincidentally, the Festival was planned to be at the same time and place as the AGM, with the backdrop of the beautiful Scottsdale Plaza Resort and the Sonoran Desert. Future Festival events may or may not be scheduled to coincide with the AGMs, but then again, you never know. The 46 acres of the resort provided a wonderful venue for a considerable number of cars as well as some very valuable cars, like C- and D-Types, XKSS's, and some one-offs that have been in museums over the years. Most of these iconic cars have resided somewhere on the West Coast for most of their lives, so it was really no surprise to see them show up for the Festival as display cars.

I was fortunate enough to have been asked to participate in the judging for the Festival on Sunday and then selected to be a team lead for the judges on XK120's in Champion Division. I felt this would be a great opportunity to get a firsthand look at some of the West Coast cars and see how they might compare to what we see here on the East Coast. This also gave me the opportunity to work with other judges from other parts of the country to see how they field the daunting task of evaluating championship contenders.

Dick Cavicke did a tremendous job as Chief Judge in organizing and implementing the judging during the course of the day's event. All judging appeared to have gone smoothly and timely, with only limited issues on a couple of cars. The judges' meeting was held first thing Sunday morning at 9:30, and all the judges were issued hats and white lab coats, which proved to be a little heavy given the 90+ degree temperatures later in the day. They did, however, provide a pretty formal presence for the entrants and spectators. Judging began promptly and every entrant was accounted for in a specific time slot for each team.

The judging was completed shortly after 4pm, with the ceremony to follow later in the day. Unfortunately, I was not able to stay, as it was time to head for dinner and the airport for our redeye return flight home. I have several accompanying photos on other pages of this issue of the Festival cars and the beautiful resort layout, so be sure to check them out.

The 2017 International Jaguar Festival will be held in October on Lanier Island, Georgia. This will be a little closer to home, so maybe we can have some of our members as participants in the Concours as well as the judging.

International Jaguar Festival, A Spectator's Perspective

Let's start at the bottom line -- the 2016 International Jaguar Festival was a huge success! It showcased the best exhibition of the Jaguar marque that I've ever seen, and the largest (140 cars) since the 1993 "Biennial" held by the Jaguar Touring Club of New Jersey. Nearly every model of Jaguar product was there on display, from the original Swallow Sidecar to the latest Project 7 F-Type. The fantastic location, incredible weather, and the unmatched quality of the Jaguars exhibited confirmed the wisdom of our decision to travel to Scottsdale from our home in Florida.

Within a day's drive or tow from Scottsdale, Arizona, there are many car collections, some of which include significant Jaguars. One outstanding example is the collection of "C and D" types owned by Terry Larson. The accompanying pictures show the finest assembly of Jaguar race cars seen since those shown in Franklin, Tennessee, in 2001. Dick Cavicke and his cadre of judges from clubs around the country seem to have handled the large numbers of judged cars quite well.

Spectators, from hotel guests to "drive-ins," abounded, and were treated to incredible "auto-art." One surprise, however, was the low profile of officials from Jaguar Land Rover at this significant exhibition of their past and current products! I would have expected a larger presence of JLR people at the IJF Concours. This was a huge opportunity for JLR to have taken advantage of the efforts of the club's volunteers, and of the time, money, and effort of the entrants, whose dedication to the Jaguar marque cannot be overstated. Here, also, was the ideal time and place for a Jaguar Hospitality tent.

The above demonstrated to me a lack of appreciation by JLR of the JCNA's value in our showcasing Jaguar's heritage to the luxury car-buying public. It also helps to explain why the JCNA and its affiliates receive minimal support from JLR. We, of course, dedicate our time and money because of our love of the beauty and performance of our Jaguars, and not necessarily to curry favor with Jaguar Land Rover.

Congratulations to the Jaguar Club of Central Arizona for a fabulous job planning and running the 2016 Annual General Meeting and International Jaguar Festival. It was one of the best JCNA events to date. We certainly expect to attend the 2017 IJF planned to be held in Atlanta, and hope to see you there!

2016 JCNA AGM

2016 JCNA AGM, Scottsdale, Arizona -- A New Delegate's Report

I had the pleasure of being one of JANE's two delegates this year for the JCNA Annual General Meeting in Scottsdale, Arizona. This was a great opportunity to meet some of the 180 Jaguar aficionados who attended, and to put faces with members I have corresponded with only by email or phone.

The activities surrounding the AGM include a meeting of the JCNA Board of Directors (Friday) where major issues and decisions about JCNA business are discussed and voted on. The JCNA BOD includes two Regional Directors from each of the six JCNA regions plus JCNA officers and committee chairs.¹ Among other things, the JCNA BOD is responsible for nominating the JCNA President and Vice President.

The actual AGM on Saturday is also a vital part of the club's management. It provides an opportunity for a broader cross section of club membership to play a part in how JCNA operates. Each of the approximately 65 clubs has the right to send two voting delegates to the AGM regardless of the number of members in the club.² These delegates have the right to voice their views on JCNA issues and to vote on JCNA changes. Clubs not attending the AGM may designate "proxies" for their votes, generally delegates from other clubs or Regional Directors.

In some years there are a number of very controversial issues on the AGM agenda, and meetings can be long and contentious. Not so in 2016. While many smaller issues were decided during the 2016 AGM, perhaps the most significant for general membership was that beginning with the 2016 Concours season, there will no longer be "non-authentic" points deductions for clear "bras" on cars in the Driven Class. Cleanliness and condition of the bra area on these cars will be judged as if the finish was the original paint.

Rules regarding bras were not changed in the Champion Class, where clear bras will continue to be subject to a non-authenticity deduction.

But the AGM is not all about business meetings. Our hosts, The Jaguar Club of Central Arizona arranged many activities for delegates and their companions. Non-business activities included the Cowgirl Fashion Show, a shopping excursion to Old Town Scottsdale, and a terrific Friday evening program.

On Friday afternoon we were taken for a tour of the Penske Car Museum in Scottsdale, which featured a broad range of Penske's Indy race cars as well as examples from his NASCAR team. Following that, we were treated to a cocktail reception at the nearby Jaguar dealership owned by Penske. In addition to the new F-Pace and XE models on display, there were examples of most of the other models in the Jaguar range. Of course, we had the opportunity to enjoy adult beverages and fine appetizers from the Capital Grille as we were checking out the cars.

Last on the Friday social agenda was a barbecue buffet at Hogs and Horses in nearby Cave Creek, Arizona. Part of the entertainment at Hogs and Horses is the opportunity to ride bulls. The local AGM organizer, Robert Bronstein, took the opportunity and he rode a bull, and not the mechanical Gilley's variety – the real thing! Now that will be tough to beat for the next AGM!

²JCNA affiliate club membership ranges from a handful of members to clubs like JANE that have nearly 300 members. We are fortunate to have such a large and participative membership that allows us to stage events like the upcoming Quebec City tour, where about 70 people have registered.

Saturday, following the AGM, the traditional JCNA Awards Banquet was held, with featured speaker Kim Mc-Cullough, Vice President of Marketing for Jaguar Land Rover. Ms. McCullough filled us in on all of the exciting new changes in Jaguar's product range.

Wrapping up the program was the annual awards ceremony, where JANE received three awards for articles appearing in the Coventry Cat:

- Travel Category: Dennis Eklof, "Oh No, Not Another E-Bay Car"
- Heritage Category: George Parker, "A Young Man and His C"
- Event Category: Brian McMahon, "2015 AGM in the City of Brotherly Love"

Finally, the Fastest Member in JCNA went again to Dean Cusano from our neighboring club JCSNE, with his Slalom time of under 39 seconds.



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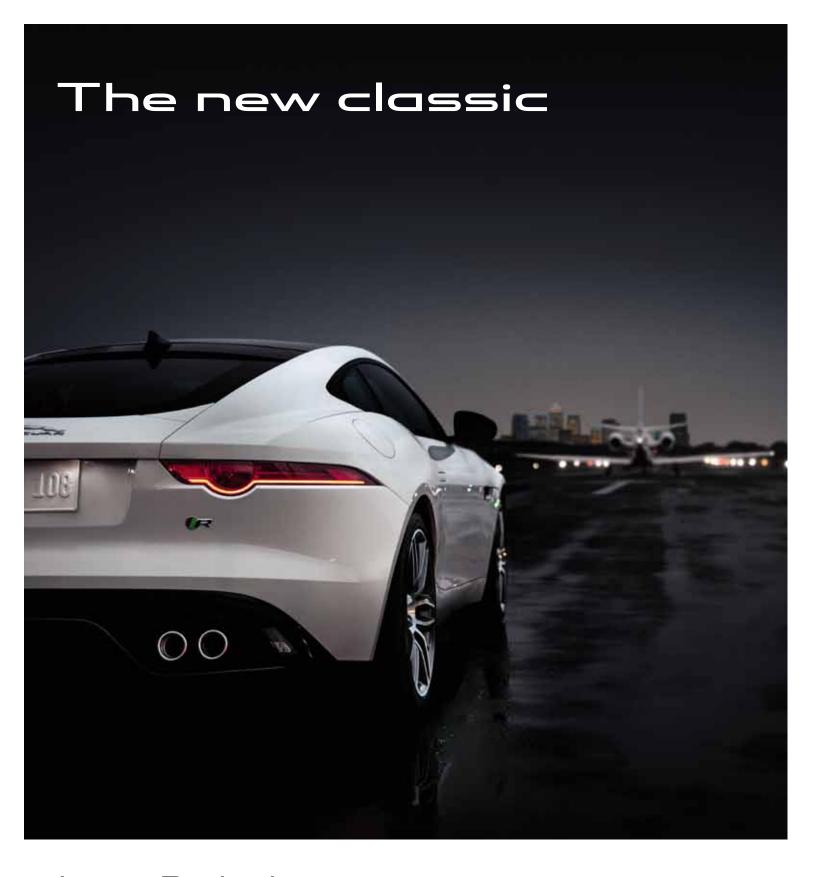
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
