



JANE's "Own" Michael Gaetano Delivers a Sensational 2016 Bristol British Motorcar Festival

JANE member Michael Gaetano has given us the gift of the "British Invasion" in Stowe, Vermont, for over 25 years. Thanks to Michael, the Invasion has become such a big part of all of our lives. Now, for the second year in a row, using the Invasion model, Michael has delivered another spectacular British car weekend, the "British Motorcar Festival," in Bristol, Rhode Island. Over 180 classic British automobiles participated, some trailered from Florida.

This year's Bristol event began on Thursday with a "Hidden Hundred Rally" that saw 55 cars with 105 participants traveling along a scenic route, with custom event license plate covers. The participants had a great lunch, a reception at the Herreshoff Marine Museum, and dinner at the Lobster Pot. Registration packet pickup

(all cars were pre-registered) began at noon on Friday. The registration gift was a beautiful fleece blanket embossed with the Bristol event logo, in a variety of colors to match our cars. That afternoon, there was free beer and wine in the "Queen's Tent," along with munchies.

After cocktails, we lined up our cars with the help of volunteers from the Bristol community, who wore blue "Bristol Team" t-shirts. The Bristol police led us down the main road, Hope Street, with all traffic blocked. We drove through town, honking, as Bristol residents lined the streets, waving British flags. We have never seen such welcoming participation and support from a town. Bristol really loves this event.

Two miles up, we were directed to a large park, right on the waterfront, where the Bristol event team and the police carefully lined up our cars for a magnificent harbor view. Of

course, in true Michael Gaetano-style, there was a large tent with wine and beer and food samples from local restaurants. Naturally, there was a live 1960s British Invasion band, playing our favorites, and I remember hearing "Satisfaction" from the Stones as we parked. This waterfront location was downtown, and all the wonderful local restaurants were open for business. We had a great meal at the German restaurant, Redlefsen's, across from the park.



Saturday was the car show. There was a new "Preservation Class," which was won by our friend Dirk Burrowes, President of RoveAmerica, with his 1910 Rover Open Two-Seater. The judged, competitive "Concours d'Elegance" featured JANE's Daniel Graf's 1948 MkIV DHC that won in its class. Second place was JANE's Keith Carlson, with his 1961 Alvis TD21 Saloon.

Now, for the "British Classic People's Choice" awards, the Bentley and Rolls Royce Class was won by JANE's Gus Niewenhous (a Concours judge), with his 1973 Silver Shadow. JANE's Andrew Comparetto's 1951 XK120 came in second in its class. JANE's Ken Coleman's 1962 MkII won its class. JANE's Joseph Hill's 1974 XJ6 won its class. JANE's Bill Richardson's 1995 XJS came in second in its class. JANE's Bill Braun's 1968 OTS E-Type came in third in its class. JANE's

Sandy Cotterman (a Concours judge), came in first in class with her 2000 XKR. Lastly, Dean Saluti and Marjorie Cahn's 2007 Estate Wagon won its class. This was nearly a clean sweep for JANE!

Also on Saturday there was a new Jaguar XE and a new Jaguar F-PACE for us to sit in, thanks to Kaplan Jaguar.

Concours judging was performed at the highest of professional levels, with JANE's Aldo Cipriano as the Head Judge. Aldo was assisted by several JANE judges, including Rod Gilbert and "Dean" Bob Doyle with knee pads, inspecting the underside of each car. The Queen herself, Michelle Dickson, oversaw the hat contest. Saturday night offered one of the weekend's highlights, a meal at the Bristol Yacht Club. Dinner Saturday evening was sponsored in part by Aston Martin of Waltham. It doesn't get any better!

More Travels with JANE: We "Invade" Quebec City!

Quebec City's strategic location guarding the St. Lawrence River means it is no stranger to centuries of invasions and conflict between the British, French, and Americans, so its citizens were well prepared for another invasion by the British (a friendly one by British *cars*, that is) when in June a veritable army of JANE members and their guests pushed 200 miles north from central Maine to Quebec City for a wonderful 3-4 day visit. The allure of Quebec City, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the hospitality of all whom we encountered made this among the largest and best JANE road trips ever.

As with most invading armies, the JANE strategy was to divide the force and approach from different directions: the main body staged in Waterville, Maine, for the initial assault from the South while a smaller group approached from the West. In such operations casualties are anticipated, and this trip was no exception. Unfortunately, Andy and Judy Picariello had to drop out due to a major mechanical breakdown of their Jaguar en route. Those who made it to Waterville, most of whom had driven from Massachusetts or New Hampshire, had time to rest overnight at the Fireside Inn and Suites on the night of June 1st and to take advantage of free refreshments

provided by the

hotel. They were joined the next morning by the Maine "militia" and other stragglers for the five-hour journey to Quebec City through the beautiful rural roads and forests of Maine and Southern Quebec. These were perfect roads for Jaguars – great scenery, few cars, and the contented roar of our "cats"! We were detained briefly at the Canadian border as our "papers" were scrutinized and we were then on our way again. The weather as we started our drive was great, but turned to rain by the time the convoy reached Quebec City. Fortunately, the next two days brought perfect weather for our "maneuvers" in and around the city.

As we entered the only walled city in North America north of Mexico and rolled down the Grande Allée to arrive *en masse* in the heart of the Old City in the late afternoon of June 2nd, we encountered no resistance – only the warmest of welcomes. The staff of the Hotel



Clarendon (the oldest operating hotel in the Old City) were awaiting our arrival and were on the streets directing traffic and guiding the Jaguars to our private, guarded parking at the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity, immediately adjacent to the hotel. The parking area was flooded with hotel staff who met us at our cars to handle our bags and guide us to a private check-in as our bags made their way to our rooms. We then had a little time to relax and check out our very nice accommodations before gathering in the bar area for a private reception with hors d'oeuvres and liquid refreshments (including JANE's own signature cocktail, the "*Coventry Leaper*"). Each member also received a souvenir glass engraved with the JANE logo to commemorate the tour. We then broke into smaller groups to sample the fine restaurants for which Quebec City is famous.

Friday morning, June 3rd, dawned with great weather. Our mission for Friday was to explore the city, so in the morning the club divided into two groups for a 2 ½-hour guided walking tour highlighting the history, architecture, and sights of the city. When we returned to the hotel, we were surprised by the number of visitors gathered in the church parking lot examining the cars. We should not have been surprised - the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity is a popular tourist attraction, its parking lot is in the hub of the Old City, and tourists found their way there to see the cars all weekend long. Our cars also provided a spectacular backdrop for the open air tables of several restaurants near the parking lot. The club members enjoyed talking about their cars with visitors and did so throughout our time in Quebec. We enjoyed the afternoon shopping and exploring the Old City individually or in small groups.

Saturday, June 4th, was a busy day! The entire group managed to be in the parking lot with engines running at 8am. The early start was necessary to accomplish all that was planned for the day. The group first drove to Montmorency Falls, about 15 minutes outside of the city. This magnificent falls is 90 feet taller than Niagara Falls (although much narrower). We rode a gondola to the top of the falls for a tour by guides portraying early inhabitants of the area. Nineteen brave

souls in the group even rode a zip line across the front of the falls while the rest

From the falls, we drove over the bridge to lle d'Orleans - a large island in the St Lawrence River east of Quebec – and stopped at the restaurant Le Moulin de St Laurent for lunch. This lovely restaurant is in an old stone mill near the St Lawrence River. Not only was the venue breathtaking, but the staff served the entire group a wonderful three-course meal. After lunch the group divided, some going to a chocolate factory and winery while others chose a somewhat longer route around the island that included a stop at a lookout tower and a different winery.

Everyone was back at the hotel by late afternoon for the big closing event - cocktails and a four-course dinner in a private ballroom at the hotel, complete with a cake adorned with the JANE logo for dessert. As with everything at the Hotel Clarendon, the food and the service were *magnifique*! JANE President Jim Sambold read a letter addressed to the hotel manager, with special thanks to the three staff members who were very instrumental in making our stay at the hotel so enjoyable.

No JANE tour would be complete without the traditional awards, so after dinner we had a bit of fun! There was fierce

competition for the "Driven the Greatest Distance in a Jaguar" prize. Would it be Bob and Mary Beth Gosende from Albany, someone from southern Massachusetts, someone who drove from Vermont to Waterville to Quebec City, or...? The unofficial "rulebook" doesn't stipulate that the trip has to be a *direct* route, so sizing up the competition, and mindful of the prestige at stake, Dennis Eklof drove FROM Groton, Massachusetts, to Waterville, BACK to Groton, BACK to Waterville, and then on to Quebec City – making him the clear winner! (We'll let Dennis fill in the "rest of the story" and why Prebble was content to remain in Waterville and not make the trip back to Groton!)

There was also a good deal of competition for the "Broken Spoke" award. Although the Picariellos were certainly in the running, the

judges decided the award should be presented in person to someone who actually arrived at the destination. That said, there was still a competition. Albert Aniel and Brigitte Ruetsche were strong contenders with the several starting issues with their E-Type, but so were Bonnie Getz and J.R. Phillips and Dixie Steadman with their flat tires. The judges ultimately chose Albert and Brigitte for their dogged determination to reach Quebec City.

The "Newest Members" award went to Frank and Janet Bajowski. They also had the newest Jaguar in the group, a brand new 2017 XE purchased just before this trip.






