
# "The Fog Comes on Little Cat Feet...."





# JANE Weekend on Martha's Vineyard What a Great Time!

Why did we have to come home? We just didn't want this weekend to end. The JANE 2016 Martha's Vineyard Weekend had 28 participants and 13 Jaguars, all, including the Jags, having the time of their lives. It rained, it was chilly, there wasn't much sun, but we didn't care.

On Thursday and Friday, JANE members took the ferry from Woods Hole, Falmouth, to Vineyard Haven on the Island. Our Jags were parked on the lower level of the ferry, and we went topside to enjoy sandwiches and beverages during the short, 45-minute, smooth voyage. We disembarked and drove the few miles to the Harbor View Hotel in Edgartown, our home base for the weekend. The hotel has a magnificent ocean view, and there was ample safe parking for our Jags. After checking in, many of us wandered through Edgartown's quaint shops and ate at local eateries. The Cipriano daughters were in their glory.

At 6pm we got together for a cocktail reception in one of the hotel's private rooms. There was cheese, crackers, and fruit, and the wine was flowing. I handed out our commemorative JANE 2016 Martha's Vineyard Tour front license plates. Dennis Eklof asked if

these license plates were OK'd by the local police. Luckily, the Dukes County Sheriff, Michael McCormack, who welcomed us, allayed our fears. I then explained our Saturday

route and distributed handouts.

We were also formally welcomed by hotel management and Nancy Gardella, Ed Hall's niece, from the Martha's Vineyard Chamber of Commerce. Nancy gave each of us a "swag bag" full of goodies, including really cool Martha's Vineyard hats. There was also an official JANE coffee mug for each participant. Lastly, our host on the Island, former Chief of Police Joe Carter, talked to us about our Saturday route, which he helped to develop. Joe introduced the Island's educator, historian, and author Dr. Elaine Cawley Weintraub. "Dr. Elaine" talked to us about the historical significance of the route that we would be taking. Dr. Elaine was excited about her role on our Saturday tour, giving short presentations at our stops.

Friday evening, we all went to Edgartown restaurants of our choice.

Bonnie Getz and Dave Moulton led a large JANE group to Rockfish. The Ciprianos were lucky enough to nab a reservation at the upscale Atria. The Carters, Centores, and Margie and I went to an Italian restaurant, of course, called Isola. Chuck Centore's blackened shrimp appetizer was "to die for."

After breakfast Saturday morning, we affixed our JANE license plates to the front of our Jags and lined up our JANE convoy in the hotel parking lot. Margie and I, after having tried out the route several times, had prepared detailed written instructions, which prevented us from straying from the route. Our JANE convoy,

after many lefts and rights, pulled into the first stop, at Edgartown Memorial Wharf. The Edgartown Police were waiting for us and helped us park our cars. Dr. Elaine talked to us about the island's whaling history and a local Edgartown "witch," who has a plaque on Memorial Wharf honoring her.

The JANE convoy then drove across the entire Island to our second stop, Menemsha Harbor. Along the way we saw farms, forests, horses, cows, and sheep. Dr. Elaine and Joe Carter were waiting for us at the Harbor. She related the story of a famous African slave who fled from bounty hunters and sheriffs, to eventually hide with the island's Wampanoag tribe in Aquinnah, our next stop. A plaque at this location recognizes this famous slave. She also presented autographed copies of her book on the island's African population to Dennis and Prebble Eklof, Carl and Sing Hanson, Dean Saluti and Marjorie Cahn, and JANE's newest member, Jason Fennessey.

The JANE convoy then traveled to stop three,

the Aquinnah Circle. The town of Aquinnah granted JANE their rare approval to park our Jags on the lawn at the Circle. The island's weekly newspaper, The Times, had alerted Martha's Vineyard residents that our Jags would be at the Circle, and they came all afternoon, in the rain, to see our cars. The Aquinnah Cultural Center and Wampanoag Museum, which was closed for the season, opened just for us, and we were given a presentation by a member of the tribe. The Gay Head Lighthouse, also closed for the season, was opened by Richard Skidmore,

the Keeper, who gave us a presentation and a tour. When we gave Richard Skidmore an official JANE plaque, two island newspapers were there taking pictures and interviewing for upcoming articles about the JANE visit.

We ate an informal lunch on the Circle - sandwiches and salads. Lunch was prepared by the Slice of Life restaurant in Oak Bluffs, and the food was "healthy." After lunch we had three different destination options to choose from. Some of us traveled to Copperworks, where artisans craft metal objects, such as weathervanes and fish artwork. Others headed for Chilmark Pottery, where they watched a skilled potter create his works on a potter's wheel. With good time management, some of us got to visit both locations. A few went directly to the Granary Gallery (option three), where the Hansons had prepared a wine and cheese extravaganza. This gallery has fabulous artwork and breathtaking Eisenstadt photos. When all of our Jags were parked at the gallery, Carl Hanson posed us for a group photograph beside our Jags, taken by a photographer from the roof of the gallery.

After having a wonderful time at the gallery, we drove back to the Harbor View Hotel to get ready for our Saturday evening dinner at the Martha's Vineyard Chowder Company in Oak Bluffs. This
