

Join fellow JANE members at our March monthly meeting to hear John Heywood's presentation, "The Jaguar in Your Future: Its Technology, Its Size, Its Source of Energy, etc." This talk will explore, in the context of petroleum and climate change concerns, how cars (and especially the Jaguar brand) are likely to evolve. John will talk about anticipated future changes in vehicles and how Jaguar might respond.

John Heywood is the Sun Jae Professor of Mechanical Engineering (Emeritus) at MIT. For many years John has directed the Sloan Automotive Laboratory and has been rewarded for his lifetime achievements in his field. His interests focus on engines, fuels, and the transportation energy interface. He has written extensively

At the January 2017 JANE Board Meeting, Paul Bicknell was appointed to fill a Board vacancy created by Dennis Eklof's recent resignation.



His current car is a *Satin Edition* S-Type 4.2, one of the last 750 produced, and is the car he drove to become the 2015 JCNA Class M Slalom Champion.

Paul has been working on JANE Slalom events since attending his first one, in 2011. He conducted these events for a number of years, and became JANE Slalom Chair this year, as Rich Kosinski has moved on to be the co-VP of events with Chuck Centore.

Paul has been involved in many motor sports and autorelated activities over the years, including an affiliation with the Sports Car Club of America (SCCA), serving on event track crews at the Nelson Ledges Race Track in Ohio. He has also been active in the staging of numerous rallies and autocross events in New York State, Connecticut, and Massachusetts. Locally, Paul is a Corporator of the Larz Anderson Auto Museum in Brookline, Massachusetts.

In addition, Paul has owned various "interesting" cars, including Austin Healeys, a Pontiac GTO with a 428 CI V8, a Lotus-powered Dodge Spirit R/T, and several VW Sciroccos. He claims that the Sciroccos were the best autocross cars of all time. Paul also owns a Suzuki Katana motorcycle, and was riding with JANE Past President Dennis Eklof long before joining JANE.

Mille Miglia Presentation by Bruce Murray at JANE Monthly Dinner Meeting – February 22, 2017

On a mild February evening, 49 eager JANE members gathered for our monthly dinner meeting at the original Longfellow's Wayside Inn in Sudbury, Massachusetts. The featured speaker for the evening was Bruce Murray, telling a tale in some detail (in his British accent) about the 2005 Mille Miglia, in which he co-drove a 1938 Maserati 8C 3000 Spyder. While the car was vintage and accepted for the rally, it had not competed during the early years when the Mille was a much more dangerous event. The event was discontinued after 1957 because of safety concerns for both the drivers and spectators. Fifty-six people had died in the 24 races run from 1927 through 1957.

The event was revived in 1977 as the Mille Miglia Storica and has been run 33 times since then as a road rally. It traverses a replica of the original race route, even using original cars when possible. Drivers are selected by the type of cars they plan to drive, and to be selected and actually drive this rally is quite a privilege.

JANE's evening started with cocktails and conversation in the Inn's pub, where Marvin, the bartender, knows most club members by their credit card numbers and drink preferences. Later we all retired to a private upstairs dining room where a buffet meal consisting of salad, potatoes, pasta salad, carrots, scrod, and roast prime rib awaited. Business announcements of upcoming events and other club affairs preceded the meal.

After the wonderful apple crisp and whipped cream dessert, Bruce was ready to start his presentation. He was well prepared with pictures and videos of the event, and gave a quite detailed description of the rally and the towns he visited. We have all been pleased with our monthly dinner events this year and look forward to having many more throughout the year. Next month we will have an MIT fellow, John Heywood, who will speak about engines of the future, and Jaguar in particular. Ought to be a pretty interesting presentation.



Only Surviving Le Mans-Winning Jaguar D-Types Headline Amelia Island Concours Special Classes

The 22nd annual Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance will honor the immortal Jaguar D-Type on the 60th anniversary of its third consecutive and final victory in the 24 Hours of Le Mans, the race it was created to win.

Jaguar Chairman Sir William Lyons considered the 24 Hours of Le Mans the most important race on the international calendar. From 1951 Jaguar won the 24 Hours five times in seven years. That competition record spurred Jaguar sales and invested the Coventry-based company with an international luster and a mystique it still enjoys.

Even after six decades the D-Type Jaguar remains one of the most alluring automotive shapes of all time. Its sculptured aerodynamic silhouette employs modern aircraft design theory and construction. In four years (1954 through 1957) the D-Type won the 24 Hours of Le Mans three times. It is a record that stands with the fabled Bentley Boys of the 1920s, Britain's first Le Mans heroes.

"The Jaguar D-Type was created to win Le Mans," said Bill Warner, founder and Chairman of the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance. "Yet the D-Type raced and won practically everywhere, especially America." Twenty percent of D-Type production had long lives in America. No surprise. "The D-Type raced at Sebring, Daytona -- beach course and the Speedway -- at Bonneville, even on drag strips and airport circuits. Indy 500-winner Bobby Unser raced a D-Type at Sebring: impressive such a specialized design," said Warner.

The World Sports Car Championship was young in 1955 when Jaguar's svelte D-Type became the first car to win the 12 Hours of Sebring and the 24 Hours of Le Mans in the same year.

Jaguar's D-type won Le Mans again in 1956, this time in the Scottish Blue livery of Edinburgh-based Ecurie Ecosse, making their Le Mans debut. It was the beginning of a heroic legend, the type that suits the legend and lore of the 24 Hours of Le Mans perfectly.

The 1957 24 Hours of Le Mans began like a Grand Prix sprint. The powerful Italians and their Formula 1 stars

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
went at each other without quarter. The blue D-Types ran to a fast yet strict plan letting the red cars exhaust themselves. Before midnight the red cars had faded and Jaguars were well in the lead with three privately entered D-Types in their very rapid and regular wake. Jaguar D-Types finished first - second - third - fourth and sixth!

Across seven years Jaguar's D-Type raced at the sharp end of the most famous, most romantic and very likely the most dangerous sports car race of all . . . the one race it was designed to win.

"The D-Type is a classic sports racing car that gets extra credit as the car that not only won Le Mans three times, but gave birth to two more Jaguar classics, the XKSS and the XKE," said Warner. "We are honored to have both the 1956 and 1957 Le Mans winning D-Types anchor our 2017 Jaguar D-Type class."

Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance runs March 9-12, 2017. If you plan to attend don't miss Legends of the Leaping Cat - Jaguar Racing Drivers Seminar on Saturday, March 11, at 10:30am. Tommy Kendall moderates a panel of racing greats who will share stories from their time racing Jaguars. Panel includes: Bill Adam, Norman Dewis, Hurley Haywood, David Hobbs, Davy Jones, Brian Redman, Chip Robinson and Bob Tullius.

Rubber Covered Omega Clips

The body wiring harnesses on XKs and early Marks were held in place by P-clamps and rubber-covered cable clips (so called "Omega Clips"). These came in S, M, and L to suit the need.

When rewiring my XK120, I was short a half dozen large Omega clips. The available clips are sold unpainted and not rubber covered, as shown. Photo 1 compares the original clip to the new. The fix was simple.

I purchased six clips from SNG Barratt. Frank, the salesman, suggested shrink wrap for the covering, which protects the wiring loom. At a nearby Trustworthy Hardware, I purchased a half dozen 3/16" ID shrink wrap pieces shown in Photo 1. They cost 99 cents/ea.

I gave the new clips a quick black painting using a Rustoleum primer/gloss, cut the shrink wrap pieces to length, and slipped them onto the clips easily with a small shot of silicon spray. They looked good without shrinking, but I shrank one with a hair dryer, liked the look, and hit the others. Each took about one minute after the hair dryer was hot. A very light coating of black paint made them look correct.

Total time, 15 minutes plus dry time; cost, \$5.94, to make my car a little more correct. The shrink wrap comes in smaller sizes to suit the M and S clips. Photo 2 shows a new covered clip compared to the old.
