


The Busiest Club in JCNA


President's Message continued





Event Reports

Slalom Corner - the JANE Spring Slalom

It was a dark and stormy night...

Well, actually, that was the evening before, when the heavens opened and the rains fell, and fell. But by the time the hardy JANE Slalomers reached the site Saturday morning, the rains had ended and only a damp mist remained. So, ignoring the forecast for more rain in the afternoon, the intrepid track crew began setting up the course and preparing for the day. The track gradually dried and that helped as the setup progressed. However, it's always an adventure setting the course in the spring, when the location of each cone must be determined to ensure the correct layout. Each fall, a spot of orange spray paint is applied to mark the placement of each cone, but in the spring it's always a challenge to find those marks, since the paint fades and flakes off during the winter. But this year there were no problems and the course was correctly placed as the pavement gradually dried out.

While the equipment was being set up, cars and drivers began to arrive, and arrive they did! This year we had one of our largest turnouts in the past few years. We ended up with 23 cars and 22 drivers. More cars than drivers? Yes, Dave Moulton brought not one, but two of his cars, and he ended up competing in both of them (one at a time of course). One was his wicked fast F-Type R and the other was his fabulous Morgan Aero-8. David did that by having a non-JANE friend, Glenn Gosselin, drive one to our Slalom site while he drove the other. We prevailed upon Glenn to "man" the stop box and left him out there for the entire day. He didn't seem to mind, since we kept bringing him food and drinks. Glenn appeared to enjoy all the action, and he managed to not get run over while manning the finish line.

Dave's Morgan was not the only fabulous car that participated. We had a Shelby Cobra, too. Tom Larsen brought his 1964 Shelby Cobra (formerly the star of the TV series *Honey West*) out to play, and play it did. It attracted a lot of attention, not only when on the course, with the sweet-sweet song of its 289 CI V8, but when it was resting between runs and people gathered around to drool over it. It even still has the signature of Carroll Shelby across the dashboard, as all true Shelby cars did.

But if one sports car with a classic 'merican V8 deserves another, then we were lucky indeed. Rick Neville,



from the local chapter of the Austin-Healey Club of America, brought his Austin-Healey 3000, into which he had stuffed a 5L Ford V8. You can be sure that no Austin-Healey ever sounded like that one. You can also be sure that no AH 3000 "lit" up the

rear wheels like it did, either, since it was still wearing its original knock-off chrome spoke wheels and narrow tires. Rick told us that he left it that way since the rear differential wouldn't have lasted if he actually had bigger wheels and more traction.

In the end, in addition to the Cobra, the Morgan, and the AH 3000, we had nine Jaguars, four Corvettes, a Fiat 500 Abarth, a Viper, a wickedly fast Ford Focus-RS, a "big" engine (1275cc) Bugeye Sprite, two very nice VW Golfs (one GTI and one Golf R), and a BMW 5-Series. Gary Hagopian was also there with his V-12 E-Type, and what a magnificent presence it was on the course!



Larry Shields ended up with fastest time of the day, again, in his 427 CI C6 'vette, but JANE member John Loring was less than half a second behind in his Viper. Rich Kosinski had the fastest Jaguar with his beautiful black XKR. The Morgan and the Cobra performed wonderfully, with Dave beating himself in the F-TypeR with the Morgan by over a second.

So, a great Slalom was held, some wonderful classic cars participated (Tom Larsen even promised to bring "something else" in the fall), all the food was munched down, the rains held off, and everyone promised to come back in September.

Hope you can all make it then, and as I've said before, we'll even have a sandwich for you.

Inn at Bay Pointe Dinner Meeting With Peter Bourassa and MMR June 28, 2017

Many of you have subscribed to Peter Bourassa's MMR online weekly newsletter blog and website. Peter, as you may know, has developed both to provide a product resource for the sports car community.

At our June meeting, Peter cleverly spoke about the journey that got him to this point in his personal life and in the business development. The result is a resource every car enthusiast will find valuable. At the Inn at Bay Pointe, we also had a special parking section in the lot next to the restaurant, beside the yachts, where our


Jaguars were displayed for all to see during our dinner. By the way, the Inn's buffet was excellent.
